Calling all Juniors – chance to speak up

Junior players will have the opportunity to make their voices heard at today's Junior Reception at the Marriott Hotel.

The event is scheduled to start at 5 p.m. in the Heritage Ballroom I. Joel Wooldridge, Bermuda Bowl silver medalist, is the guest speaker.

Members of the five-person Junior Task Force – made up of members of the ACBL Board of Directors – will be on hand to hear what players have to say about attracting more Junior players to the game.

Five members of the ACBL Board of Directors make up the task force: Phyllis Harlan, chair, along with Bob Heller, Shirley Seals, George Retek and Glenda Calkins.

Free-play age limit raised for Juniors

Thanks to action by the ACBL Board of Directors, more Junior players will be able to play free in regional events at NABCs, starting with this tournament.

The ACBL Board approved a measure to provide free-play coupons to ACBL members 18 and younger for regional events. The previous upper age limit was 15.

Phyllis Harlan, chairperson of the ACBL Junior Task Force, said the Board's decision "reaffirms the League's commitment to Junior players."

Junior players who wish to compete in nationally rated events can take advantage of the \$10 coupons available to eligible ACBL members for any NABC event. Players 20 and younger are entitled to the \$10 coupons, as are players up to age 25 who are full-time students.

Tight grouping at top of Kay Platinum Pairs

Australian Ishmael Del'Monte and Frenchman Thomas Bessis start play today in the Norman Kay Platinum Pairs with a slim lead and several pairs nipping at their heels.

Their score of 329.54 is less than one matchpoint clear of Drew Casen and Jim Krekorian, lying second with 328.84. Only .16 matchpoints back in third place are Mitch Dunitz and Mark Perlmutter.

The event concludes with two final sessions on Sunday.

Tar Heels lead Lebhar IMP Pairs

Charlotte NC players Robert Bitterman and Jerry Helms will start the first of two final sessions in the Lebhar IMP Pairs today with a lead of less than one-tenth of an IMP. Their carryover score of 17 is razor thin at .09 IMPs. Right behind them are Hailong Ao of Herndon VA and Jian-Jian Wang of Clarksville MD.



I can't help falling in love...

Before I share today's "Wisdom of Elvis," I want to tell you about one of my best Memphis memories.

Years ago, friends of mine got married in Memphis at the Peabody Hotel downtown, and my mind still goes to that trip when I am thinking

about luxury and pampering. You can keep your little modern "boutique" hotels; just give me those glorious glamorous dowagers, dripping with gilt, carved wood, acres of velvet drapes, jaw-dropping ceilings...all the touches you'll never see again.

The Peabody has lovely restaurants with sumptuous food, elegant rooms and ballroom, opulent furnishings and décor. But what makes the Peabody unforgettable is the Duck Parade. Twice a day, the Peabody duckmaster (yes, it's a real job, held by a real person) parades mallard ducks on a red carpet through the lobby. During the day, they happily splash in the main lobby fountain, and at 5 p.m., the duckmaster takes them back to the Peabody roof, where they live. The process is reversed in the morning at 11 a.m.

I arrived a day early for the wedding, and thought I would treat myself to high tea in the lobby and enjoy some people-watching. I was agog when I saw real live ducks blissfully splashing in the fountain of this formal, marble lobby.

Then the duckmaster arrived and, with much pomp and circumstance, rounded up the ducks, led them waddling across their special red carpet and into the elevator. It was a "Did I see what I think I just saw?" moment. Briefly, the lobby was a fairytale place with reality suspended. Sort of like the bridge table at times, no? I don't know how this originally came to be, but my guess is that it involved some very high-proof beverages.

If you have time (never mind...make time!), check this out. I promise you a memory that will make you smile every time it comes into your mind. We need those, don't we?

And the high tea and people-watching is pretty great, too!

Here's today's Bridge Wisdom from Elvis. My first bridge teacher was Charlotte Roseman. She was a saint. She gave Gary and me a private lesson every Wednesday before the game for three and a half years, and never yelled at me once. She gave me a passionate love for the mysteries of this game and a sense of wonder at the magic found in 52 little pieces of paper. She would call me early in the morning to describe a hand. Even after playing for 60 years, she would be excited about it. By the way, don't blame Charlotte for my bridge transgressions! I assume all responsibility!

Occasionally like all of us, Charlotte would fall face-down in the mud over a hand and go down for a phone number. More often, though, she would take a dreadful hand and turn it into gold.


"Marti, I just couldn't help it. I fell in love with the hand," was the explanation for both extremes. "Sometimes you just have to ignore common sense and go with your heart."

Elvis understood the helplessness, the hopelessness, the irrationally that sometimes overcomes us. He summed it up in his "I Can't Help Falling in Love with You."

Wise men say only fools rush in but I can't help falling in love with you. Shall I stay? Would it be a sin If I can't help falling in love with you?

Like a river flows, surely to the sea Darling so it goes, some things are meant to be. Take my hand, take my whole life too, for I can't help falling in love with you.

One of my beginners picked up this hand as South. She knew her Elvis and she was in *love*!

Oh my. She played it like a star, winning the ♠K lead in hand, cross-ruffing until she set up her spades, gave the opponents a trump winner and smiled sweetly. When I asked her about her thought process, she said she knew when she bid 6 ♦ that her partner would correct to spades if it was the better contract. I commented on the courage it must have taken for her to bid slam with only 4 HCP and a partner who did nothing but pass.

"How about that!" she said. "I didn't even notice it only had 4 points. All I saw was 13 cards in two suits! It made my toes tingle. I was in love."

Charlotte would get it, I get it. How about you? A little foolishness in falling in love isn't the worst thing that can happen to you.

Bidding commentary: North's jump response
to 2NT after a takeout double is a popular

convention called Jordan. It shows limit raise values, 9-11 support points, with at least four-card support. A direct jump to 3 \(\text{ is preemptive.} \) If you mentally replace the \(\text{ A} \) With a small diamond or the \(\text{ K} \) With a small club, you will get an idea of what a jump to 3 \(\text{ looks like after a takeout double.} \)

As South, knowing of the nine-card spade fit, reevaluate upwards. The player who receives support - South - adds 2 extra points as a bonus just for the nine-card fit. Additionally, if the long hand contains a singleton or two doubletons as South's hand does, another point is tacked on. Using this method, South's hand has blossomed from 15 to 18 points, enough to bid 4 . If South bids 3 ., his partner is supposed to pass.

Defensive commentary: As East, if declarer leads a heart from dummy at trick two, play an honor and switch to a spade to stop dummy heart ruffs in dummy. As West, if declarer mistakenly leads a spade at trick two and exits with a heart, play low, allowing partner to win and play a spade.

Play commentary: As declarer, the dummy cries out to be used for ruffing hearts. Your plan

should be to ruff three hearts in dummy. A heart, not a spade, should be led at trick two. You need those spades in dummy to ruff hearts. Unless you are playing against close friends or relatives, you can expect the opponent who wins your heart exit to lead a spade. If you play a heart at trick two and ruff your other three losing hearts in dummy, you will make an overtrick, losing one heart and one diamond. If you play one round of spades before leading a heart and they switch to a spade upon taking the first heart, you will lose an extra heart trick but still make your game, but you should not be proud of yourself. Finally, if you played two rounds of spades before leading a heart, keep it a deep, dark secret.

You can fool Papa Sims once...

No Passing Fancy, Sue Emery's book celebrating 50 years of contract bridge, contains a number of deals featuring the bridge greats of yesteryear. Here's one illustrating the battle of wits between P. Hal Sims and Josephine Culbertson during the famous Sims-Culbertson match in 1935. Sims was playing with his wife, Dorothy. Jo was playing with her husband, Ely.

Mrs. Culbertson opened the \$5, Sims played dummy's three and Culbertson's 10 won the trick. A heart return put Sims in; he drew trumps and then led a club, which Mrs. Culbertson won with the ace. She promptly led the \$4.

Sims gave the matter some thought, but finally decided that Joe would not underlead the same ace twice. So he played the jack, and the AQ won. Culbertson returned a spade, and Jo's ace won the setting trick.

The microphone through which every bid, play and remark was transmitted by radio to the world stood at Culbertson's right. He leaned over and said,

"It is a very rare but a very great pleasure to fool Papa Sims. In this instance, Mrs. Culbertson fooled him twice on the same hand. It has never been done before."

Doublers mean business

According to David Bird's *Famous Bridge Records*, published in 2002, the following deal holds the record for most doubles in an auction. It occurred during one of the most bitterly contested matches of all time – the 1975 Bermuda Bowl final between the famous Italian Blue Team and The Aces.

Bird writes: "The Italians proceeded to test every available stopping place, but the Americans had them on the hook and would not slacken the line. Garozzo ended in 2 doubled, going down three for minus 500. That was 13 IMPs to USA when 3NT went three down at the other table."

Ten Easts' discards allow grand to make

Alphonse Moyse, reporting on the 1941 Summer Nationals (as the NABCs were known at the time) in Asbury:

A bridge tournament is a bridge tournament, and it cuts no particular ice that one is swept by ocean breezes and another by mountain zephyrs. No bridge player ever looks out the window anyway, and I suggest to the American Contract Bridge League that it might save a lot of money by holding some of its contests in an abandoned coal mine.

On this freak, there were almost as many bidding sequences as there were N-S pairs. Most, sensibly enough, were satisfied with a small slam contract in spades, hearts or notrump, but 10 of the more aggressive partnerships gamboled merrily into 7NT. Reluctantly, I must admit that Dick Frey and I were in this unselect group. I say "unselect" because it is quite obvious that 13 tricks were not there for the taking. I was South and, for reasons that now are not so clear to me as they were at the time, got extremely fancy, to wit:

My general idea in bidding the minor suits and not even mentioning spades was, of course, that I had immediately determined to play the contract in notrump and was trying to build up a possible double. I thought that by concealing my solid suit entirely, I might get a better result than by advertising it. It did not seem likely from the distribution of my hand that a suit contract would produce more tricks and, of course, in a field of this type, there is a heavy tendency toward notrump contracts with their superior matchpoint scores.

Amazingly enough, every team in 7NT, regardless of the bidding, brought home the contract! Even more amazing, this victory was largely the result of a horrible discard on the part of the various East players. In almost every case, the opening lead was the fourth best diamond. The created very little guess; it was pretty obvious that a player would not have led away from a king against a 7NT contract. Hence we all ducked in dummy. East put in the nine, and our 10-spot held. I don't know how all the other declarers felt, but I was far from sanguine. I ran off the seven spades, discarding five hearts, a club and a diamond from the dummy. West correctly let go all his diamonds and one club. East, for reasons that will never be clear to me, held on to the ◆K and let go a club. Only one, but that was enough! I led the club jack to the ace, a low club back to the king and then cashed the ◆A. West, having to hold the high club in front of dummy's seven spot, had to let go the low heart. Dummy, discarding after him, threw off the club and then, praying for the final bit of luck, I led the low heart. The king was a beautiful sight to behold!

At a couple of tables, West resolved the declarer's difficulty on the spot by making the "surprise attack" of the low heart, figuring that by forcing declarer to a premature guess he might talk him out of a certain finesse. Since there was no hope of making 13 tricks unless the \mathbf{v} Q would hold the first trick, however, these declarers let the lead ride, and after that they had at least 17 tricks.

Electronic Device Policy

1. For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.

For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.

3. These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

4. A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

Monitoring

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. Please summon a director if a problem occurs at the table.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

Vanderbilt pre-registration

If you are planning to play in the Vanderbilt Knockout Teams, you must sign up by 8 tomorrow night. To register, see Tournament Director Steve Bates in the Convention Center, Ballroom A.

Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Mrs. Young's delayed free raise is worthy of comment. She had properly passed on the first round, but when Mrs Sobel showed great strength by her club bid at the three level, felt that her three trumps to the 10, her doubleton diamond and her considerable club support merited a raise. Moreover, she realized, Mrs. Sobel would be in somewhat of a sport if she (North) passed again over 3.

West opened the \bigstar K and Mrs. Sobel shrewdly ducked to insure against East's later taking the lead with the possible \bigstar J. West then made a splendid shift to the \bigstar A. Had she failed to do so, declarer's play would have been geatly simplified – on a diamond continuation, declarer would have won, cashed the two top trumps, then led the \bigstar K. West would have found herself on lead and forced to return a heart or a diamond, either of which would have afforded entry to dummy for the vital club finesse.

The play of the ♥A made matters a bit tougher, but Mrs. Sobel found the solution. At the third trick, West shifted back to diamonds and South was in with the ace. The ♠A was cashed and then a low spade was led from the king. West won with the ♠Q and now was in the position mentioned above – she had to give dummy the lead.

It is interesting to note that if West had followed up her previous shrewdness by making a sensational unblocking play with the ♠Q (throwing it on the ♠A) the contract inevitably would have been defeated. Declarer could not have thrown West on lead and never could have reached dummy for the club finesse. This, however, was asking a bit too much of any woman – or man – in the West position.



Her most famous bridge exploit was making a slam off all four aces, a feat that was publicized in the New York Times.
