## Juniors have a lot to say at reception

Gone are the days when the Junior Reception attracts more adults than teenagers. With the breakthrough session at the 2012 Spring NABC in Memphis, word has apparently spread that the ACBL is seriously interested in hearing what Juniors have to say about the game and how more of them could be attracted to bridge.

At Saturday's meeting, more than 50 Junior players showed up and, led by Brian Delfs, ACBL's manager of education, there were lively discussions of a number of topics.

The players cheered when Delfs told them that plans are to redesign the Youth 4 Bridge website, creating a new site from scratch.

Many ideas were voiced by the players, some of whom were recognized for qualifying to play at the 14th Youth Team Championship, starting later this month in Taicang, China.

Howard Weinstein, a member of the U.S. Bridge Federation Junior Committee, attended the

reception and gave his approval to the effort.

"It's good," Weinstein said, "to let the kids get together and let them know they're not alone – and anything we do for the Juniors will pay off in the long run."

Said Delfs, "Our direction for this reception continued on page 7

# No rest for busy former ACBL board member Gerard

When she was
ACBL President in
1992, Joan Levy Gerard
wrote a monthly column
for the Bridge Bulletin.
It was called From
Pretzels to President, a
reference to her many
years of work for
bridge in a variety of
capacities, including



hospitality at tournaments (the pretzels).

Gerard says that when she left the ACBL board at the end of 2011 – after representing District 3 for 26 years – she had gone full circle: "From President to Pretzels."

Well, not exactly.

Although she no longer represents her district on the ACBL board, the White Plains NY resident is nearly as busy as ever. Gerard is president of the U.S. Bridge Federation, represents the ACBL at World Bridge Federation meetings, is in charge of appeals at WBF championships and chairs every regional in her district, among many duties.

Former board colleague Craig Robinson, who represents District 4, says he recently spoke to Gerard's husband, Ron, about his wife's departure from the board. "He says Joan has gone from 18-hour days to 16-hour days," Robinson notes.

Gerard was such a presence on the board that it seemed she was born into the role. She actually jokes about it: "My mother wheeled me into my first board meeting in a baby carriage."

Gerard became interested in bridge as a child through her father, Daniel Katz, when the family lived in New York City. "He played with Charles Goren and Lee Hazen," she says.

She also played while attending Smith College in Northampton MA, where she studied education and sociology. For a time after graduating, she taught first grade.

Gerard learned about duplicate in the late Fifties and became involved in District 3

#### Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow

Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

#### **Slow Play**

Slow play, as opposed to careful or thoughtful play, is discourteous to your opponents -- and to all other competitors as well. Players and pairs who take more than their allotted time are subject to penalty.

In general, pairs who are rarely late will be warned while pairs who are habitually tardy and/or pay no attention to time limits will be penalized.

#### Check cashing and bridge bucks

The check-cashing desk on the 5th floor of the Marriott will be open daily 9 to 10 a.m.

- ACBL bridge bucks will be available at the check-cashing table.
- Bridge bucks may be purchased using cash, check, MasterCard, Visa or Discover.
- There is a \$500 limit.
- Players cashing checks or purchasing bridge bucks must provide their ACBL player number.

#### **Junior Coupons**

Junior coupons will be made available for junior members in good standing for entry into events at NABCs:

Any junior under the age of 26 years who is a full time student (must provide proof of eligibility) will be entitled to coupons that can be used for any event. These coupons will have a value of \$10 per session.

Any junior under the age of 21 years will be entitled to coupons that can be used for any event. These coupons will have a value of \$10 per session.

Any Junior 19 years and under will be granted free plays for each session of regionally rated

# JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

# Is that a forcing bid? By Lynn Berg

One of the biggest problems in many bidding sequences is trying to decide if a bid is forcing, or to figure out how to force the bidding. It can be particularly difficult in a competitive auction.



Your partner has opened 1NT. The

next person doubles or bids 2. and you have no problem if you've agreed that systems are "on" in this situation. But what if the opponent has overcalled 2. You have:

You have to make a decision about the value of this hand. If you don't think it's good enough to force game, probably all you can do is pass. But with 5-5, you may take to heart the late Bernie Chazen's recommendation that you should "come alive."

You could have the agreement that 3♦ is a transfer to hearts, but I don't think that's a good idea. Instead, have the agreement that 3♥ is a game force with a five-card suit. Partner will raise to game with three hearts. She won't bid 3NT without a spade stopper. In fact, without a spade stopper, she can bid 3♠ and ask you to further describe your hand. After all, you'd also bid 3♥ with:

You can also ignore the interference and transfer at the four level with a six-card or longer suit and a willingness to be in game. With:

★8 6 ★K Q J 9 4 2 ★K 3 2 ★6 3, you know you belong in game in hearts. A Texas transfer of 4 ♦ puts the contract into the right hand. You don't have a terribly strong hand, but game is worth the try.

When you have a weak hand and there's interference, many times you just pass. Sometimes, though, you can tell partner whether or not you're interested in going on.

Again, partner has opened 1NT. This time,

there's a 2♥ overcall. Some people would double 2♥ as a stolen bid, but that deprives you of the chance to make either a penalty double or a negative double after interference. Instead, make 2♠ a non-forcing bid. With a better hand, you can jump to 3♠, a game force.

The two-over-one approach, especially after major suit openings, is the current response to some of the problems of forcing the bidding. It is convenient to know that our partnership belongs in game with the simple bid of  $2 \clubsuit$  or  $2 \spadesuit$  in response to  $1 \blacktriangledown$ . The bidding can be kept low to investigate the most likely game or slam. The danger comes when a forcing bid is made with a questionable hand. Because 1NT is forcing for one round in this approach, it's not necessary to make shaky new bids at the two level or to employ Jacoby 2NT with a hand where you're not really interested in slam.


Even if you're not playing 2/1, be careful about bidding new suits at the two level with questionable hands and bad suits. It's a good idea to plan ahead and have an idea what you will do next. Too many of us bid very passively; instead of thinking ahead, we wait to hear what partner has to say and then flounder mentally when surprised.


Why not take advantage of the opponent's bid in a competitive auction to tell partner about your hand? Partner has opened 1 ♥. There's a 2 ♦ overcall. If you bid 2 ♥, you're showing a single raise in the 6-9 point range. But what if you have ♠K 6 3 ♥A J 9 7 ◆4 2 ♣K T 9 8,

#### or **★**K 6 3 **★**A J 9 **★**4 2 **\***A Q 9 7 3?

In a competitive auction, jumps to 3♥ and 4♥ can be, by agreement, preemptive. When you have a good fit, tell partner and make bidding harder for the opponents. But when you have a good fit and points, you should employ a different strategy. Cuebidding the opponent's suit is forcing and gets partner's attention. You expect partner to bid again and to let you know










if he has more to tell you than the suit he has just bid. This approach also works when partner has overcalled.

Years ago, my partner, Gail Rust, and I were playing against two men we didn't know. The guys were having a very involved auction with lots of Alerts. When the auction was over and East was asked about one of West's bids, he said, "I'm not sure, but I know it was forcing!" As Jerry Helms has said, "All strange bids are forcing." If you don't have a clue what partner means, you should probably bid again.

# Thinking bridge By Eddie Kantar



**Opening lead:** ♠J.

Bidding commentary: It pays to open 2NT with a balanced 20-21 count, five-card major notwithstanding. The opening lead should come up to, not through, the strong hand. If South opens 1♥, hears a 1NT response (likely) and raises correctly to 3NT, the strong hand will be the dummy. Seeing the strong hand on the table makes for much more accurate defense.

**Lead commentary:** At a trump contract, a suit headed by two adjacent honors is considered enough of a sequence to justify leading the top honor. At notrump, three adjacent honors (J-10-9), or the third card missing by one (J-10-8) is considered a sequence and the top honor is led. When the third card is missing by more than one place (J-10-7-3), lead fourth best.

**Further lead commentary:** When partner leads a jack against a suit contract, third hand assumes a suit headed by the J-10, or shortness if the 10 is visible. It also might be from the K-J-10-(x) (playing standard leads). Rarely, if ever, from a suit headed by the A-J-10-(x). One seldom underleads aces at suit contracts to begin with and never smack into the strong hand. Please.

Play commentary: South, missing the ♥Q, is looking at a vulnerable club holding if East gets in. On the bright side, South is looking at a fourth diamond upon which a club can be discarded. To avoid an accident (East getting in prematurely), South crosses to the ♥K and then leads a heart to the jack (finessing through the danger hand). Even if West wins the queen, the ♣K is safe from attack. As it happens, the finesse works and 11 tricks are taken. "Eight ever, nine never" does not apply when there is a danger hand. Keeping the danger hand off lead takes precedence.

# Parking at the Philadelphia NABC

Did we mention how easy it is to take a train to Market East Station, which is right under the convention center? The cost is only \$1 if you have a Medicare card.

If you are determined to drive:

There will be reasonable rates for parking in the area of the Marriott during the Summer Nationals. Through Parkway Corporation, we have arranged for substantially discounted rates at two sites:

- Juniper on Filbert Street between 12th and 13th, immediately behind the Marriott, \$15/day. The same rate applies to overnight parking.
- 12th Street on the west (right) side of 12th Street. 1-1/2 blocks of the Marriott, \$10/day. This facility may fill up quickly. See alternatives below.

If you park at these facilities, you will receive a ticket when you arrive. When you come to the Marriott, make sure you pick up one of our discounted tickets at the information booth. You will use this ticket when you pay for your parking on the way out. Everett Young, parking chairman, or a committee member will be at the information booth daily for about 1/2 hour before the 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. sessions; also for about 15 minutes after these sessions. Tickets may also be available at the information booth whenever it is manned.

These rates are for all day. There is no time limit. Be aware that "early bird" rates at other lots may appear to be competitive, but the hours usually don't work with our bridge schedule. Often they require you to be out by 6 p.m.

Other sites of interest include:

At www.philadelphia.centralparking.com you can print out discount coupons for lots at 11th and Race (right side), or 12th and Sansom (on the left side of the street across from the Parkway lot). Currently the rate is \$12 for 12 hours. We will have copies of those coupons available at the information desk.

#### Longterm parking

The best deals for longer term, overnight parking are near the airport. Google discount parking at the airport, Philadelphia, and you'll find parking rates currently as low as \$4/day. These facilities will provide free transportation to the airport. An inexpensive (\$3) train from the airport to Market Street East is a half-hour ride.

- The parking lot between 15th-16th and on Spring Street (1/2 block south of Vine Street) is \$5 evenings after 5 p.m. and \$5 on weekends. Savings for those willing to walk 10 minutes.

#### **Monitoring**

At this and future North American Championships, ACBL will be monitoring NABC+ events with visible, real-time cameras. The images will be recorded and will be available for later official inspection and review.

By general monitoring of the session and participants' behavior, ACBL has another source of information that may be useful in determining facts and settling issues arising from some types of ethical and behavioral complaints or actions. Please summon a director if a problem occurs at the table.

This procedure is intended to assure everyone that the playing field is level and that misbehavior will not be tolerated.

# Watch those spots By Barry Rigal

A complaint occasionally leveled against the Daily Bulletin is that the deals might be over the heads of the average player. Let's try to rectify that with this deal from the first qualifying session of the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs.

♠ 10962 Bd: 12 Dlr: West **♥** 8 7 Vul: N-S ♦ J ♣ A 9 6 5 4 2 **∧** A Q 7 5 4 **♥** A K 5 ♥ O 10 4 2 ♦ A 10 9 6 5 3 ♦ K Q ♣ Q 8 7 **4** 10 3 **★** K 8 3 **♥** J963 ♦ 8742 ♣ K J

If you're anything like most of the hand-hogs in the LM Pairs, you open the West hand 2NT and play 3NT on a low club lead – the 5. South wins the king and returns the jack. Cover or duck? And why?

The answer comes down to the simple issue of the rule of 11. Fourth highest leads and the rule of 11 tell West that on the lead of the \$5, the other three players have six cards higher that the 5 among them. When the \$K and \$J are played by South, West can place North with \$A 9 6 5 (x) (x). Ducking the jack may not be a *good* chance – but it is the *only* chance!




# Tough competitor By Barry Rigal

Paul Trent was one of the top players in the country in the Sixties. His wife, Sandy, may be less well known but no less accomplished, as this deal (board 26) from the second qualifying session of the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs demonstrates. Sandy was South.



West led the ◆9 to the king and Sandy's ace. She led a trump to the queen and ace and won the diamond return in hand to test trumps and find out the bad news.

Now she cashed the ♠A and ♠K, pitching the ♥A. She ruffed a spade to hand, led a heart to dummy's 10, ruffed another spade to reach this ending:



Sandy now played the ♥Q to dummy's king and advanced the ♥J, prepared to discard her diamond if East followed or overruff if East could ruff in. Contract made!

Incidentally, try playing 6♣ on a spade lead. You's win the ♠A, ruff a spade, and lead a club to the queen. If a diabolical East wins to return the ◆J, I dare you to finesse.

administration in the mid-Seventies.

In 1981, she and the late Dick Hewitt were the driving forces behind the organization of the Bermuda Bowl in Rye NY, and she has been involved with the WBF ever since. She does hotel negotiations for the WBF whenever the organization plans a championship in the U.S.

Besides chairing the regionals in her district, Gerard also manages all contracts and meeting planning for the district. She has been on the USBF board for six years and recently took over as president.

Says Robinson, "No one works harder for bridge than Joan."

Gerard says she has no regrets for the major investment of time and energy on behalf of the game. "I owe almost all my friendships to bridge," she says.

She laughs when she recalls a bridge column written by the late Alan Truscott about her marriage to four-time North American champion Ron Gerard in the Seventies. The headline read: "Top bridge player and top administrator marry." Says Gerard: "I called Alan and asked him, 'Who is who?"

Gerard does play occasionally, but she also likes spending time with her children – Susan Pollack and David Levy – and their five children, all of whom live nearby in Westchester County in New York.

Apart from those leisure-time activities, however, it's all about bridge for one of the most highly regarded administrators in the game. "I have tried hard," she says, "to make things happen that would be good for bridge."

#### **Bid Box Alerts and Announcements**

When using bid boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

# Slow play: the curse of the game

Patty Johnson, Sebring FL, is a National Tournament Director and the Director-in-Charge for all District 9 (Florida) tournaments.

An old tournament director friend of mine, John "Spider" Harris, was famous for the saying: "Slow play is the curse of the game." Nothing is more frustrating for tournament directors than having to herd players along like cattle when slow play isn't actually the problem.

If you take a moment to think about it, most of your opponents do not take that long to bid or play a deal -- yet before you know it, the round is being called and you are nowhere near finished with the last board.

Here are some suggestions which, if followed, would solve many of our problems.

First: do not post mortem between deals whether you are in a pair game or a Swiss team event. Finish the round and then discuss hands if there is still time. We, as directors, will not cut your time but I think you will find yourselves under less pressure by following this suggestion. Remember: we provide hand records in pair games so you don't have to worry about forgetting a particular holding.

Second: if you are on opening lead, make your lead before recording the contract in your private score. You will have plenty of time after leading to record the information and still see the entire first trick.

Third: unless you have a legitimate reason to leave the table, such as the restroom or a smoke break, please remain at the table and visit with your opponents. You might actually find this enjoyable and a new way to make friends or future Swiss team partnerships.

I wish we could make these suggestions into rules enforceable by penalty but none of us wants a bridge event decided by the pair with the fewest penalties. All I can do as a director is to ask the cooperation and help of all players because I think not only you but everyone else will enjoy their tournaments more.

Remember: those who enjoy a tournament will continue to play. Do your part to make bridge enjoyable for yourself, your partner and your opponents -- you can't play without them.

#### **Electronic Device Policy**

The electronic device policy is revised as follows:

- 1. For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.
- 2. For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.
- 3. These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.
- 4. A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

# Tournament Terminology 101

If you're confused by the terms used to describe the different types of bridge events played at clubs and tournaments, you're not alone. Here's a list of common bridge events with explanations.

**Knockout Teams:** an event in which a team (of four, five or six players, with four playing at a time) plays another team. The losers are eliminated or "knocked out" while the winners play other winners until only one winning team remains.

The length of a KO match may vary from a single session to a full day (the Vanderbilt and Spingold) to a multi-day event (the Bermuda Bowl).

**Bracketed Knockout Teams:** a KO event in which teams are divided into groups (usually of 8, 16 or 32 teams) based on their masterpoint holdings. The top group (Bracket I) and all other groups compete in a separate event with their own set of winners.

**Compact Knockout Teams:** a shorter version of Bracketed KO teams.

**Swiss Teams:** an event in which a team (of four, five or six players, with four playing at a time) plays other teams in seven-, eight- or nine-board matches. Team A sits North-South at Table 1 and East-West at Table 2 while Team B sits East-West at Table 1 and North-South at Table 2. The results are compared and scored by International Match Points (IMPs).

Pairings for the first round are random. Pairings for succeeding rounds are determined by a team's win-loss record or Victory Point total.

International Match Points (IMPs): the most common method of scoring Swiss Team matches. Scoring example: if Team A scores plus 620 for bidding and making 4\*S\* on a particular deal and Team B scores only plus 170 (they didn't bid the game), the difference is 450, which converts to 10 IMPs. The IMP chart is shown on the inside of your convention card.

Victory Points (VPs): a method of scoring Swiss Team matches. After the scores are compared and converted to IMPs, the IMP total is converted to Victory Points. A team's VP total may be used to determine its next opponents and its final standing.

**Side Game Series:** a series of single-session pair games that pay red points. These series include at least three sessions and may have as many as six. You may play in as many sessions as you like, but only pairs who play in at least two sessions are eligible for overall gold points. Your best two sessions are used for determining overall winners.


