There were few dry eyes in the audience when the diminutive Gottfried was called to the podium by Goodwill Chair Sandy DeMartino. Gottfried seemed overwhelmed by the honor and was speechless for a few minutes as she listened to praise after praise for her long service to the Washington Bridge League as the queen of hospitality.

Margot Hennings, who represents District 6 on the ACBL Board of Directors, said Gottfried was the late Nadine Wood's top helper for more than 40 years. "It's nice to be able to recognize people who have given so much to bridge," said Hennings.

When she took the microphone, Gottfried said she had a lot of help with her hospitality duties. "We had lots of good people from the WBF," she said. "Volunteers need other volunteers."

As she made her way back to her seat after offering thanks for the honor, she received a standing ovation.

### Hawkins, Yomtov capture Silver Ribbon Pairs

Lifelong friends Allen Hawkins and Bernie Yomtov reunited to win the Levintritt Silver Pairs on Monday night. It was touch and go – they dipped to second going into the last round, but emerged the victors by 52 points – less than a board (on a 77 top). The win is the first North American Championship for both men.

Finishing second, with 2532 points, were Allan Siebert from Little Rock AR and Don Caton from Pensacola FL.

Hawkins says he and Yomtov played competitively 40 years ago, but family and work became priorities. They got back together a couple of years ago. "We play recreationally," he says, and only at NABCs. Earlier this week the pair nabbed third place in the IMP Pairs.

Hawkins, a bank examiner, hails from Birmingham AL. Yomtov is an investor who lives in Cambridge MA.

## Taking care of business

Gianarrigo Rona is a busy man. Having just finished running a meeting of the World Bridge Federation management committee in Dallas, the WBF president now turns his attention to the World Youth Team Championships in Turkey, where at least seven ACBL teams will travel in August. His schedule also includes promotion of the 14th Red Bull World Bridge Series in Sanya, China, this fall.

There are many other tasks, including cementing a relationship with the International Olympic Committee, planning other world championships in faraway places and seeking sponsors for tournaments.

Rona said he is optimistic that the tournament in China will attract a large contingent of ACBL members. "I have spoken to many Americans who are interested," he said.

The Sanya tournament is the largest of the WBF events and is open to anyone who is in good standing with his national bridge organization (e.g., the ACBL). There are open, women's, mixed and senior pairs and teams. All play will be at the MGM Grand Sanya and the Sheraton Sanya Resort, which are five minutes' walk from each other.

He said the WBF and the Chinese Contract

Bridge Association are preparing to accept 200 teams and 400 to 450 pairs for the various events.

Rona said bridge is undergoing a renaissance in

China, which will send many players to the world championship. "It is a big occasion for them to play against the best players in the world," he said.

The addition of Red Bull (makers of a popular energy drink) as a sponsor is a big deal for bridge, Rona said. It is noteworthy, he said, that Red Bull has a high sponsor profile in many sporting events, including Formula One racing.

"This is important for us," Rona said. "Red Bull is well known around the world. We may be opening continued on page 5

### Deadline looms for Open U.S. Bridge Championship entries

The United States Bridge Federation will select the USA1 Team for the 2015 Bermuda Bowl in team trials that begin on Friday, May 9.

The deadline for entries is Monday, April 7, at midnight. The tournament is open to USBF members who have paid their 2014 dues.

The 10-day event is being held in Phoenix AZ at the Scottsdale Embassy Suites. Organizers anticipate conducting the contest in five, two-day stages: the first stage will be a round-robin among all teams except those with byes to the knockout phase; the other stages will be 120-board knockout matches.

### Wash your hands

When using bidding boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

Eric Leong sat South, and after opening 1♦ in third seat and hearing a 1♠, response from partner, he judged his hand too good for a 4♠ splinter raise of spades. Not everyone would agree, but he bid 2♥ and heart 3NT (roughly 9-11 high-card points). A 4♠ cuebid for spades got a bid of 5♠, so he offered a choice of slams with 6♠, which North was happy to pass.

West led a club, and Leong drew trumps, discarding a club from dummy, and led a low heart from hand. With the ♥A onside, he had a perfect Morton's Fork Coup. If West took his ♥A, declarer had two discards for his low spades. If he ducked, the ♥K would go on the ♣A and declarer would lose just one spade.

The fall of the doubleton ♣Q J was irrelevant and annoying because it meant 6NT might make, but taking 12 tricks in 6♦ was still a fine score.

## JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

### Director, please! By Brent Manley

Here are a couple of famous bridge quotes from anonymous sources.

"We had a partnership misunderstanding. My partner assumed I knew what I was doing.'

"You know you're in trouble when the first thing the opponents do is draw trumps – and you're the declarer."

Most people think of Blackwood 4NT – arguably the world's favorite convention – as a way to get to slam. Although many iterations of the convention these days seem designed to do just that,

Easley Blackwood originally intended the use of his convention as a way to avoid bidding bad slams -i.e., when the opponents have too many aces.

It its basic form, 4NT asks partner to tell the



number of aces he holds. Responses:

- 5♣ = All or none
- 5♦ = One ace
- 5♥ = Two aces
- $5 \triangleq$  Three aces

If the 4NT bidder can tell the opponents have two more aces, he can sign off in the agreed trump suit. If the 4NT bidder finds that his side has all the aces and he thinks a grand slam is in the offing, he can bid 5NT to ask about kings. Responses are the same. Note that bidding 5NT guarantees that the bidder's side is missing no aces.

There's actually a better way to use 5NT. Instead of responding numbers of kings, bid them up the line. Say you have a couple of kings and partner bids 5NT. Instead of bidding to show two kings, information that might not help partner, bid your lowest-ranking king first: 6♣ says you have the ♣K and possibly others. Skipping a king denies possession of a lower-ranked king. For example,  $5NT - 6 \spadesuit$  shows possession of the  $\spadesuit K$  and denies possession of the ♣K. With no kings, return to the trump suit.

In recent times, Roman Key Card Blackwood has surged in popularity because of the increased

accuracy. In RKCB, the trump king is counted as a key card. Responses:

5♣ = zero or three key cards (there are five key cards)

- 5♦ = one or four
- 5♥ = two key cards without the trump queen

5♠ = two key cards with the trump queen.

Some reverse the meanings of 5♣ and 5♦ in a version known as 1430 (1 or 4, 3 or 0 key cards).

It's easy enough to learn the responses to regular Blackwood, RKCB or any of the other permutations. What apparently is not so easy for some new players is figuring out when using Blackwood of any flavor is inappropriate.

Do not use Blackwood if:

(1) You have two or more quick losers in any suit. You might find you are off just one ace, but if you have a low doubleton or worse in a side suit, the opponents could easily cash the ace and king in that suit to beat your slam.

(2) You have a void in a side suit. If partner has the ace in your void suit, it might well

be useless to you, and you could miss a grand slam because you won't know if partner has the ace to cover your singleton.

(3) Partner's response could get you too high. Say your agreed suit is clubs and you feel like slam might be in the offing. You could get in trouble

bidding 4NT if you have only one ace because partner might bid 5♦ (one ace), which you can't pass. You'll end up in slam off two aces. Playing RKCB, if partner shows two key cards, one of them might be the trump king, in which case the opponents still have two aces. Ouch!

Opening lead: ♥K Declarer wins the ♥A and proceeds to rattle off seven top spades. Partner follows to one spade, discards the ♣Q on the second, and then discards hearts. You have to reduce to five cards. What should they be?

Clutch those four diamonds for dear life! And it doesn't matter what your other card is. Declarer

can't have any more hearts. If she did, she would have ruffed them before drawing trumps. Your hearts are worthless.

Partner's discard of the ♣Q (an honor discard) tells you of a strong sequence in clubs and also tells you that it is safe for you to discard clubs, even the king, if necessary.

It's unthinkable to lose points holding that South hand, but one defensive inference (not ruffing any hearts in dummy) and one discard (the ♣Q) tells you all you need to know.

I was East. Joe Grue, South, opened 1♦ and John bid an invitational 2NT, which was raised to game. Expecting a doubleton or tripleton ♥K on my right, and knowing my partner held any entries for our side, I tried leading the ♠10. We play Rusinow, so it showed the jack or shortness. Was this a good lead? Only time would tell.

Doug encouraged with the 4 and declarer won in hand to take the diamond finesse. Doug won the king on the second round and shifted accurately to the ♥10. This is a card he would have led with or without the ♥A. John thought long and hard and eventually decided to duck. He ducked again when Doug continued the suit, and the best I could do was win and cash my ace to hold the contract to nine tricks and a huge swing for North-South. They scored 47 on a 53 top – the scores would have roughly reversed for down two.

South led the \$\delta 4\$ and I decided to win in hand and lead a spade to the jack. North won and returned a club. When I ran the diamonds, each defender had to make four discards. South threw two clubs, a spade and a heart. North pitched three hearts and a club. These made the most sense if the cards were distributed as they in fact were, so I exited with a low heart from dummy to score 11 tricks. This was worth 35 out of 53 MPs. I had hoped for more, but given the way the rest of our session went it would not have helped!

### Be Scent-sitive!

Some people have an extreme sensitivity to fragrances (colognes or perfumes). Many ACBL clubs, units and districts have adopted policies that prohibit players from wearing fragrances. The

ACBL has not issued an official policy on the matter, preferring instead to appeal to the goodwill of its members to refrain from using fragrances.

Because duplicate bridge requires players to be in close proximity to each other, individuals who suffer from fragrance-related reactions cannot avoid those who are wearing them. Among the commonly reported symptoms are intense headaches (indeed, fragrances can frequently be a trigger for migraine sufferers) or breathing-related problems. For these individuals, the issue is much more serious than simply disliking a particular smell — it's a real health problem.

The ACBL asks everyone to give this issue the consideration it deserves. Please, if you're going to play in a club or a tournament, don't wear cologne, perfume or scented lotions.

The honor for Gottfried was part two of the Volunteer of the Year award presented by 2014 ACBL President Bill Cook, who said he could not select just one recipient from the list of candidates given to him. As president, it was his duty to select the volunteer award winner or winners.

Co-winner Silvana Scotto was hailed for her dynamic performance as the top fundraiser during the joint operation between the ACBL and the Alzheimer's Association last summer during the Longest Day event. Scotto's Sagamore Bridge Club in Syosset NY (Long Island) raised more than \$80,000 for the cause.

Al Levy, who represents the district that encompasses Long Island, said Scotto has few peers when it comes to energy. "She is an amazing woman," Levy said. "She has run a number of businesses but took some time off to grow her family." Noting that Scotto has five daughters, Levy said, "That alone gets you a medal."

Levy said Scotto is a dynamic recruiter, outstanding club owner and volunteer, serving on the unit board.

Scotto said her success has been a team effort. "I could not do it by myself. There is an incredible group at my club."

Her family comes first, Scotto said, "but bridge is the second most rewarding thing in my life."

There were other honorees at the meeting.

Karl Dencker of Lake in the Hills IL was introduced as the Goodwill Member of the Year for his energetic promotion of bridge through tournament organizing and a dogged determination to make sure any player who has attended one of his tournaments knows there's a welcome mat waiting at the next. If someone misses one or two of his tournaments, that person can count on receiving a postcard urging him or her to play again soon.

District 8 Director Georgia Heth said that when Dencker started helping out in the district, "he came on at full speed and did it all. He is always looking for new ways to help the players and support bridge."

Dencker said, "It's a great honor to be among all of you nice people."

District 16 Director Dan Morse presented a certificate of appreciation from the ACBL to Charlie Price, longtime District 16 volunteer. Price has served in numerous positions in the district, including president, vice president, treasurer, mediator and tournament chair for 25 years.

The meeting got off to a lively start after DeMartino opened the proceedings with a welcome.

CEO Robert Hartman thanked Gottfried and Silvana for traveling such a long distance, then he recounted a story of how he made someone's day at the bridge table – and it wasn't by going for 800.

Hartman said he wasn't feeling good about the session because things were going wrong left and right, and when a pair came to his table, he said, "Welcome to table three." Hartman said he didn't

think his greeting sounded enthusiastic, so he was surprised when one of the new opponents, a woman, said, "That's the nicest thing anyone has said to me all week!" Hartman said it felt good to know he helped someone enjoy the game a bit more.

Hartman was about to step away from the podium when District 23 Director Rand Pinsky shouted, "How did you get table three?" It was a reference to the position normally reserved for top-

Not missing a beat, Hartman replied, "I'm a seed in the 99er games."

ACBL President Phyllis Harlan welcomed the group and praised them for being "the epitome of what goodwill should be. You wouldn't have goodwill pins if you weren't. We thank you for all the good work you do."

DeMartino closed the meeting by reminding Goodwill Committee members that, "you can be competitive, but you can also be friendly and ethical."

a small window to get other sponsors."

Rona said players who are interested in competing in Sanya should consider registering as soon as possible because space could be a problem.

He said there are direct flights to Sanya from many locations in Asia, including Hong Kong and Beijing. The weather in the seaside resort is expected to be in the mid-70s most days, similar to Bali, Indonesia, where last year's world championships took place. "Bali was one of the best events WBF has had, and Sanya has many points in common with Bali," Rona said. For more information, visit www. worldbridge.org.

All efforts of the WBF and the local organizing committee are aimed at making sure players are comfortable where they stay and where they play. Pairs events will be enhanced by the ability of players to scan their tournament badges to get printed results and matchpoints immediately after every session.

The tournament in Sanya will take place after the big event in Istanbul, where there will be five U.S. teams and two from Canada. Another U.S. team has been invited to play in the team championship for players 13 to 15 years old. That event includes free entries and free room and board for the invited squads. In all, 10 teams have been invited for that event. So far, Israel, France and Poland have agreed to send teams.

Rona said there will be 60 to 65 teams in Istabul. The tournament is hosted by Koc University, one of the country's most prestigious institutions.

The WBF president said the efforts to attract more young players "are starting to have good results, and this is important. The young players want to compete. Many countries now accept that youth are the guarantee of the future."

Rona said he is happy with the WBF's decision to do away with appeals committees, as the European Bridge League did last summer. He noted that when he was elected president of the Italian Bridge Federation in 1986, "the first thing I did was get rid of appeals committees because of the politics."

He said players have accepted the decision, in large measure because of the expertise of the tournament directors rendering the ruling and the process by which they arrive at their decisions. "We have a good team of TDs," he said.

### **Slow Play**

Slow play, as opposed to careful or thoughtful play, is discourteous to your opponents -- and to all other competitors as well. Players and pairs who take more than their allotted time are subject to penalty.

In general, pairs who are rarely late will be warned while pairs who are habitually tardy and/or pay no attention to time limits will be penalized.



## Struggles in 3NT by Barry Rigal

This deal posed a tough declarer play problem for East players in 3NT.


After South intervened over East's strong 1♣ opening and North-South found their spade fit, East played 3NT on the lead of a fourth-highest ♠3. He won then ran clubs. Dummy pitched spades, North spade, spade, ♠7, South discarded a low diamond and a low heart.

This was the position as declarer saw it:



My instincts are to trust the opponents and lead a low heart to the 9. If South can duck his now-doubleton  $\P K$ , he deserves to beat me. The defenders will cash their spades, but you can cross to the  $\P A$  and advance the  $\P Q$  to pin South's remaining high spot card.

Declarer actually led a heart to the queen and king. North returned a spade and South cashed out the suit. This was the ending now:




On the  $\spadesuit$  4, West pitched a diamond, North the  $\spadesuit$ 10 and East the  $\blacktriangledown$ 8. Now when a heart comes back, declarer can win and lead the  $\spadesuit$ Q to scoop up North's jack and take trick 13 with the  $\spadesuit$ 9.

East led a low diamond to dummy's jack, which held. Sealy then played a low spade, covering West's 8 with the 9, East winning the jack. Now a heart went to West's ace and a diamond was returned. Sealy won the ♦A and played the ♠Q, covered by the king and pinning West's 10. Plus 650 was good for 48 out of 51 matchpoints.

Sealy reflected that West might have given him a losing option by playing the ♠10 on the first round of the suit, which might well have been from a doubleton 4J 10. Sealy would cover with the queen, losing to the king.

In that scenario, after regaining the lead Sealy would have had to decide whether to run the \$9, trying to pin West's 8, or play to dummy's ♠A, picking up the now-singleton &J offside.

### **Smoking Policy**

Smoking is not permitted in the playing area during any bridge playing event at an NBAC. This includes electronic smoking devices.

### **Vendor locations**

There are several vendors – books, jewelry and other items – on the first floor of the Conference Center in the area where regional and national events are being played.

### **Cash concessions**

The cash concession stand is in the Grand Hall on the first floor of the Conference Center (near the bookseller).

### **Rockwell Mixed Pairs**

The Mixed Pairs is a four-session event with two qualifying and two final sessions. Each pair must consist of a male and female partnership. The Rockwell Trophy, donated by Helen Rockwell in 1946, is presented to the winners.

### **Electronic Device Policy**

The electronic device policy at NABCs allows players to bring electronic devices such as cell phones into the playing area provided that such devices are turned off.

Further, any such equipment must not be visible during the session

The policy applies to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, kibitzers and play recorders, except those designated by the ACBL and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

A violation of the policy will result in an automatic disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the

### The Insider

It will be warmer on Sunday – the high was three degrees cooler than Saturday. 0 for 4.

As a result, the Insider was suspended without pay for the day. No Insider, no Insider column yesterday. A punishment for the Insider? Or, a reward for Daily Bulletin readers? The decision is yours.

Now, about the masterpoint scandal: Years ago the majority of ACBL headquarters staff played bridge. In recent years, employees such as Richard Oshlag and Jay Baum accumulated their share of masterpoints. Various others from Horn Lake picked up the stray point when their schedules allowed.

Bridge is alive, well and growing in the Greater Horn Lake Metroplex. (And, contrary to the thoughts of the conspiracy theorists, they did not "find" their points on the floor outside the ACBL mastrerpoint



If East declared 3NT, a heart lead would hold declarer to nine tricks. If West was declarer, North had to steer clear of a major-suit lead and start with a passive club.

With the spade finesse working, declarer has 10 winners. How to maneuver an 11th?

Deep Finesse might give you more than one solution, but at our table North had felt obliged to double a 1♦ opening, so all the missing major-suit honors are marked with North.


The simplest route to 11 tricks is to win the ♣K and run the diamonds, reaching this position:



On the last diamond, North throws a heart. East and South discard clubs. Declarer discards a spade from dummy takes the spade finesse, then ducks a heart. If North pitches a spade, declarer discards a heart from dummy and leads the ♠J, ducking when North covers. Declarer loses just one more trick.

Jan Jansma achieved 11 tricks as West on a slightly different variation after a top club lead by North.

He won the ace and ran the diamonds, South making the slight error of discarding spades. This was the ending:



The ♠J went to the king, ace and 9. Jansma cashed the ♣K to squeeze North out of his ♥J, then led a spade to the 8. If North won, he could cash his ♥A but would then have to lead from ♠7 4 to dummy's ♠Q 6. If North ducked the ♠8, he would be thrown in with a heart to give dummy one more spade trick.

You have to sympathize with Jeff Roman on this deal from the Kay Platinum Pairs. He ran into an unfriendly life of the cards and, after trick one, a diabolical defense.

Roman declared 6♠ from the North hand and received the friendly lead of a low diamond. Naturally, he led a top heart from hand. Sartaj Hans as West won and led a low trump. Roman won in hand, played his second top heart, then tried to ruff his two heart losers in dummy.

Peter Gill alertly ruffed in with the ♠9, so Roman overruffed and reached this point:

Roman guessed correctly not to try to ruff his heart in dummy. Instead, he returned to hand with a trump, on which Hans discarded his ♣3 (he could see the squeeze coming).

Now when Roman ran his winners and came down to the two-card ending, he had squeezed West but did not know it. Roman took the club finesse and went two down.

## **Electronic Device Policy**

The electronic device policy at NABCs allows players to bring electronic devices such as cell phones into the playing area provided that such devices are turned off.

Further, any such equipment must not be visible during the session

The policy applies to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, kibitzers and play recorders, except those designated by the ACBL and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

A violation of the policy will result in an automatic disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

### Playing in an NABC+ pairs game? **Buy your entry early!**

In an effort to speed up the start of all NABC+ pairs events – which require additional time for proper seeding – the ACBL asks participants to please buy their entries at least 15 minutes before game time. This is especially true if you expect to be a seeded pair.
