

Wu wins Mini-Spingold

Edmund Wu got a late birthday present when his team won the 0-5000 Mini-Spingold two days after he turned 26. They defeated the team of Robert Bernstein 151–146.

Wu of San Francisco played with Jesse Chao, also of San Francisco, Alex Dezieck of Taipei, Taiwan, and Zhou "Jimmy" Wang of Jersey City NJ. William Zhu of New York also played on the team through Thursday but dropped out

Defenders repeat in Red Ribbon Pairs

Paul Hattis and Jim Orleans won the Bean Red Ribbon Pairs, defending the title they first won in 2015. Hattis, of Newton MA, and Orleans, of Boca Raton FL, were second after Friday's qualifying round and scored 64% in the first final session to take the lead in the event. The second final session yielded only 51% for the pair, but the strength of their carryover allowed them to win by more than a board.

Their secret to success this year? "Try to bid notrump," said Hattis. Orleans noted that he and

Juanita Chambers

1956-2016

Three-time world champion and 18-time NABC winner Juanita Chambers died Friday in Dallas TX at age 60. Chambers was slated to play on the U.S. Women's team at the World Bridge Games in Wroclaw, Poland, in September with partner Lynn Deas.

"We played forever," Deas said. "We used to win everything. Both of our dreams had always been to play together in a world championships."

In the past few years, Chambers had made a remarkable comeback after leaving bridge in 2001, when decades of drug abuse caught up with her.

As Deas said, most people who are away from the game for such an extended period of time aren't able to play at the same level again. For Chambers, it was just a year and a half between returning to play in side games at

Zimmermann, Fleisher meet in Spingold final

The teams of Pierre Zimmermann and Marty Fleisher reached today's final in the Spingold KO Teams. Zimmermann defeated Lavazza 150–111, while Fleisher escaped Strul 111–108 in Saturday's semifinals.

Zimmermann is playing with Franck Multon, Geir Helgemo, Tor Helness, Krzysztof Martens and Dominik Filipowicz. Fleisher's lineup is Chip Martel, Roy Welland, Sabine Auken, Joe Grue and Brad Moss.

The Zimmermann team, originally seeded No. 8, got off to a big first-half lead of 84–28 in their match against Lavazza (4). Lavazza cut the lead in both the third and fourth quarters, but only by single digits each time

The other match was much closer. Fleisher (2) took a 36–15 lead in the first quarter. Strul, originally seeded 11th, gained ground in the last three quarters, briefly taking a lead in the fourth quarter before giving it back.

Onstott romps in Roth semis

The squad led by John Onstott won the qualifying round of the Roth Open Swiss Teams on Friday and maintained an iron grip on the contest throughout the semifinal round Saturday. Onstott and company (Drew Casen, Mike Passell, Chris Compton and Joshua Donn) finished well ahead of the pack and will enjoy an almost full-round carryover advantage over their closest competitor, Robert Hollman's team who sits second after the semifinal. In third is the team captained by Jimmy Cayne.

Forty-four teams advanced to today's two-session final.

Byrnes leads Mixed Swiss

The squad captained by Dori Byrnes of Morris Plains NJ leads the list of qualifiers in the NABC 0-10,000 Mixed Swiss Teams. In second is team led by R. Rubinstein of Brooklyn NY, and in third is Howard Parker's (Clements CA) squad.

Twenty-eight teams will compete in today's twosession final.

Cinderella at the NABC

On the Wednesday evening before the Summer NABC started, a charming French woman at my social bridge club mentioned that there were free lessons at the upcoming tournament and sent me a link. Having resumed playing social bridge recently after a break of 48 years, I was eager to improve my play.

The morning of Friday, July 23, when I finally found the proper room at the Marriott thanks to a very helpful official, instructor Barbara Seagram was halfway through the lesson. Another official immediately put me at a table where a hand had been dealt and sorted, and I was instructed to bid before I even sat down. Barbara's clear and effective step-by-step instruction proved so useful that at the end, when she encouraged people to grab a partner and head down for the free Newcomer's game in less than half an hour two floors down, I assumed it was just another lesson and decided to participate. A lovely woman named Sheila asked me to be her partner, and we agreed to meet at our assigned table.

When we both got there, she asked me what conventions I played. I could only answer I wasn't sure. Her pleasant face froze. Then, without any introduction, we were hurried to play. Only then did I understand that this was a competition and started apologizing to my partner for my ignorance. After the fifth "I am so sorry," the other players shushed me. Silenced, I played with terrorized and mortified focus.

Fourteen hands later, exhausted and humbled, I couldn't wait to escape. However, my partner Sheila insisted on checking the scores. We ranked first with 70-plus percent, and she earned 1.89 points. She suggested that I become an instant member, and a volunteer kindly waited while I, astonished and thrilled, borrowed enough cash from a neighbor for the membership fee.

Over the weekend, I returned for Bridge University, Audrey Grant's lesson for newbies, and two other Newcomer Pair sessions on Sunday with a good partner match.

Yesterday, I returned with my new partner, excited and challenged to be starting my career as a duplicate bridge player.

An alert reader. . . By Barry Rigal

Fans of Dave Barry's side-splitting column will no doubt be familiar with his use of the above phrase, which usually precedes a tall but true tale.

In this case, our reporter is Ira Herman, who gave this splendid take on an old theme.

- **♠** A Q 7
- **♥** K Q J 7 6 4 2
- **♦** 10 5 3
- **♣** —
- **★** K 10 6 2
- **♥**83
- ♦ Q J 7 2
- ♣ A 6 4

After North opens 4♠ (Namyats), you declare 4♥ on the lead of the ♣K. Plan the play.

At the table, South did what the majority of declarers would surely have done, escaping punishment thanks to a careless defense. South pitched a diamond on the A and led a heart up. This was the full story (spots approximate):

- **A** Q 7 **∀** K Q J 7 6 4 2 **♦** 10 5 3
- **▼**10 3
- **♦**964
- **♦** J 8 5
- **♥** 9
- ♥ A 10 5 ♦ K 4
- ♦ A 9 8 6 ♣ K Q J 10 2
- ◆ N 4 ◆ 9 8 7 5 3
- **♠** K 10 6 2
- **♥**83
- ♦ Q J 7 2
- ♣ A 6 4

All East had to do was win the ♥A and play the ♦K and a diamond to West's ace for a third diamond to promote East's ♥10. West, however, failed to find the killing play.

Declarer should have played a second club at trick two to pitch a diamond. This might, I admit, expose you to a ruff against a 5-1 diamond break, but the actual danger from the 4-2 diamond break is surely higher?

Once you pitch a diamond from dummy the defenders' communications are irreparably cut. You will cross to hand with the ΔK to lead a heart up in due course and cannot be prevented from making 10 tricks



The road to improvement By Brent Manley

Before we get into one more useful bidding agreement, here are a couple of tips for improving your game.

Read – I was a voracious reader of bridge books when I started out and I credit a lot of that study with helping me recognize situations the first time they came up at the table. My favorite authors are Eddie Kantar and Mike Lawrence.



Any book by either is more than worth the price. Mike's "How to Read Your Opponents' Cards" was the book that opened my eyes. Get this book!

Watch the experts – You can kibitz at tournaments like this one. Even better, you can watch matches with commentary by logging into the vugraph at Bridge Base Online. At home at your club, ask the better players for advice. Most good players are happy to share their knowledge and experience with you.

Work with your partner – Concentrate on being on the same page with bidding and carding agreements. Always be calm and supportive. Both of you will play better if your partnership is based on trust and respect.

Okay, here is another convention worth mastering.

Negative double. This one is essential in today's competitive atmosphere. Let's say you have **♠**6 5 4 **♥**K J 8 7 **♦**K Q 4 3 **♣**7 4. Partner opens 1**♣** and your right-hand opponent overcalls 1♠. Now what? It's a quandary if you're not playing negative doubles. You have 9 high-card points, so you want to bid, but 1NT is out. You don't have a stopper in spades. Well, how about 2♦ or 2♥? Nope: bidding either at the two level shows five in the suit and at least 10 HCP. Finally, you don't want to raise partner's suit with a doubleton.

If negative double is on your card, you're set. Double in this situation is for takeout, with a virtual guarantee that you have at least four hearts. If you don't have good support for diamonds in this

situation, you should be able to go back to partner's suit. You might have a hand such as

♠6 5 4 **♥**K J 8 7 **♦**K 9 **♣**J 10 7 4. If partner bids diamonds, you can go back to clubs.

You can use the negative double when you have five or more in a suit but not enough HCP to bid the suit directly. Say you hold:

\$5 4 **♥**K J 10 8 7 6 **♦**Q J 4 **♣**J 10 and partner opens 1♣. RHO overcalls 1♠. You can double and later bid hearts – if the bidding is not too high when it gets back to you - to show a hand with a long suit that is lacking the high-card strength to bid directly. You could do the same if your long suit was diamonds.

Note that your convention card has a section for Special Doubles, including negative. Right next to the box you check is the word "thru." You should decide how high the opponent's bidding can go before the negative double is "off." Most pairs play it through 3 - that is, if an opponent overcalls at the four level, double would simply show a good hand, "cards," in the vernacular, without promising any particular suit.

The higher the interference, the more highcard strength you need to make a negative double. If the overcall is 3♠ and you double with 6 or 7 HCP, partner will probably have to bid at the four level and he will not be happy with a weak dummy, especially if he's playing a doubled contract.

Quick Tip

Be disciplined with your takeout doubles. I see many new players doubling without support for unbid suits and exclaiming, "But I had 13 points!" Even worse, when partner bids the doubleton, they want to bid notrump with a 12-point hand. Yikes! Doubling and bidding notrump indicates a hand too strong to overcall 1NT (15-17).

Some 13- or even 14-point hands simply are not suitable for direct action. In many cases, however, you will have a second chance. Say you hold:

♦ A J 9 7 **♠**A 10 6 5 **♥**K 7

Your right-hand opponent opens 1♣. Unless you are willing to overcall a four-card suit, you should pass. Say you pass and LHO bids 1♥. Partner passes and RHO raises to 2♥. Now you can double to show spades and diamonds, the unbid suits.

Take all your chances at bridge

West leads the ♥Q. Plan the play.

Discard two spades on the ♥A and ♥K and ruff a spade high. Cross to the $\bigstar K$, saving the $\bigstar 4$, and ruff a spade high. Return to dummy using your ♦4

and ruff dummy's last spade. With the major suits eliminated, lead a low club and cover whatever West plays. Once East wins the trick, you can only lose one more club trick. East has to lead a club, establishing your king, or give you a ruff and a sluff. If he does, ruff in your

hand, the longer club hand, and discard a club from dummy, the shorter club hand.

As an aside, with this club combination and no possibility of eliminating suits, the best play for one of the first three tricks is to start by leading low to the 8! If this loses to the 9, lead low to the king next. If the 8 loses to an honor, lead low to the 10 next. You take a trick whenever West started with J-9-x(x) or Q-9-x(x). You lose the first three tricks when West started with $\triangle A$ 9 x (x). In other words,

you are a 2-1 favorite to score a trick by playing as recommended.

Finally, as East holding the ♣Q J 9, take the 8 with an honor to encourage declarer to lead low to the 10 next. If you take the 8 with the 9, you force declarer to play partner for the ace by leading low to the king next. The full deal:

- **★** 10 6 4 ♥ A K
- ♦ K 6 5 3 2
- ♣ K 108 **♠** J 3 2
- **A** 9 8 7 5 **♥**8432
- ♥QJ109765
- **♦** 7 **♣** A J 9
- ♣ Q 6 5
- ♦ A Q J 10 9 8 4
- **♣** 7 4 3 2

♠ K Q

Given this club distribution, if you don't eliminate the majors before leading a club, you will lose three club tricks. Only a miraculous club lead defeats this contract.

Use of the bidding box — Alerts and Announcements

When using bidding boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

Notice to players

Each player must have an ACBL convention card filled out and on the table. Please note that other types of convention cards, such as the WBF convention card or homemade cards that do not sufficiently resemble the ACBL convention card, are not acceptable substitutes.

the 2014 Spring NABC to coming in second in the world in the Venice Cup last fall in Chennai, India. "She was the same or better than before," Deas said.

When their team won the Women's U.S. Bridge Championship in June, Chambers was overjoyed. "I don't think I've ever seen her so excited," friend Carole Weinstein said.

As recently as Wednesday, Chambers told Deas in an email that she was still hoping to play in Wroclaw despite her illness. "She had her ticket," Deas said.

Along with her numerous championships, Chambers was known for her vivaciousness and glamour as someone everyone wanted to be around. Friends shared memories of her on BridgeWinners. com. Among them was Lynn Baker.

"Juanita was an immense talent who played the game with uncommon joy and great sportsmanship," Baker wrote. "I never heard her say an unkind word to a partner or an opponent. How wonderful that she was able to conquer her demons and return with great success to the highest levels of competition before her untimely passing."

She was born Juanita Tah in Ponca City OK on July 11, 1956. Her father, an Apache, was an engineer who moved the family often as he worked building power plants. Juanita attended Kentucky State University and Kilgore College in east Texas, where she began playing bridge. Soon after she discovered duplicate and after one club game was hooked immediately. "I fell in love with it and joined the ACBL on the spot," Chambers told the Daily Bulletin last year.

At her first tournament in Amarillo, she met pro players and began pursuing bridge seriously at the same time she moved to Dallas. She was mentored by Hemant Lall, Kerri Sanborn and the late Mike Smolen, with whom she won her first NABC title in 1979 in the Rockwell Mixed Pairs. She married Neil Chambers in 1983.

Between 1979 and 2001, she won 18 NABC events, including the Wagar Women's KO six times, the Machlin Women's Swiss four times, the Freeman Mixed BAM three times, the Marsha May Sternberg Women's BAM twice, the Keohane North American Swiss and the Whitehead Women's Pairs. She won the Venice Cup in 1987, the World Mixed Pairs with Peter Weichsel in 1990 and the World Olympiad Women's Teams in 1996.

During that time, sponsors aware of her alcohol and drug habits would arrange to have someone stay with Chambers during tournaments to keep her from going overboard. Weinstein recalls being assigned to keep Chambers on the straight and narrow in the 1990s

"She told me, 'I have to get up early, I'm in a 48-step program," Weinstein said. "She had so many vices, but she was able to poke fun at herself."

Chambers had been a drug user since high school, and in 2001 addiction began to take over her life. She stopped showing up at tournaments and, after running out of money, began selling possessions to buy drugs. She remained on that path until 2009, when she was arrested and jailed for cocaine possession in Boca Raton FL. A friend contacted her brother, Ed Barganier, with whom Chambers

hadn't spoken in 30 years. He showed up in court and arranged for her release and return to Dallas, where he sent her to rehab. She spent a year at a residential facility – "It was six months before the fog lifted," Deas said – and after that stayed two years as a counselor helping others overcome addiction.

Religious faith was a big part of recovery for Chambers. "I used to go to the bar," she told the Daily Bulletin last year. "Now I go to church."

It stuck. "She was very happy in finding her new religious life," said friend Peggy Sutherlin.

"For the first time in her life, she had her own place; she was supporting herself," Deas added.

In late 2012 she returned to playing club games in Dallas and did some teaching there. "She was a really good teacher," said Barbara Ferm, who took lessons from Chambers and had been her partner for the last two years. "She was a really warm, loving person," Ferm said, holding back tears. "I would never have been in this arena without her."

In 2014 Chambers played side games at the Dallas NABC, and a year later in New Orleans, returned to high-level competition. "She had to learn all the new bidding," Deas said. "When you go out for five years, it's like night and day." Chambers had been gone longer than that.

When Sylvia Moss, a member of one of two teams that won Venice Cup berths in the Women's USBC last year, was unable to go to Chennai and dropped out a few weeks before the Venice Cup, Chambers was added in her place. She had just a few weeks to learn Moss's notes, but she pulled it off and the team won a silver medal.

During this year's trials, Deas said, Chambers was already sick and having breathing problems, but no one knew because she never complained. "She played great," Deas added. Sanborn will take the place of Chambers in Wroclaw.

She is survived by two sons, a daughter, two grandchildren and a brother.

Electronic Device Policy

1.11.1 The electronic device policy at NABCs allows players to bring electronic devices into the

playing area. Except for health-related equipment and/or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, all such devices must be inoperable and turned off.

1.11.2 Any device capable of either sending or receiving electronic signals must not be visible during the session.

1.11.3 This policy applies to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders and kibitzers with the exception of those persons designated by the ACBL. This policy is in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

1.11.4 A violation of the policy will result in an automatic penalty pursuant to Law 91 of the Laws of Duplicate Bridge of one full board at matchpoints/board-a-match scoring, 12 IMPs at IMP pairs/knockouts or 20% maximum of VPs available per match in a Swiss team event for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be required to leave the playing area for the remainder of that session.

From the beginning of the tournament, parents talked about the benefits of bridge for the children they brought to Washington. Anissa Dyen, who lives in the Orlando FL area, came with three of her children. They were among 32 players from District 9 who "have made friends and memories that will last a lifetime."

Another group came from Toronto, host of next year's Youth NABC, scheduled for July 27-29. Michael Yang founded Toronto Youth Bridge in 2013 and runs a bridge club to sustain his teaching activities. His organization now has about 50 members. Ten Toronto Youth Bridge players competed in Washington.

Another boost in attendance came from Silicon Valley Youth Bridge, 24 of whose members came to Washington to compete. Two schools in Orange NJ brought a total of 18 students. One teacher said students who joined bridge clubs at the schools were considered "nerdy" until other students saw how much fun they bridge players were having.

Barbara Clark – tireless promoter of youth bridge

One of the most energetic supporters of the Youth NABC and bridge in general, especially for young people, is Barbara Clark of Orange NJ. She is education liaison for ACBL Unit 140 and she has

tapped into numerous sources for donations to her program, including the estate of a wealthy man.

Clark, former director of special services in the Orange school system, started the school bridge program in Orange in 2003. It is now operating in



two schools, Oakwood Barbara Clark

Avenue Community
School and the Park Avenue School.

When school administrators took a favorable view of bridge teaching, Clark found a teacher on the staff who is a player. They developed a lesson plan. They soon found that the students took to bridge with enthusiasm. "We realized that the kids really like bridge," Clark says.

Some of the students like bridge so much that they come back to Park Avenue for the bridge even after they finish the elementary grades and go off to high school, where there are no bridge classes.

The young bridge players of Orange NJ experienced their first Youth NABC in Atlanta in 2013. Clark paid for nine players to attend the tournament. Some of the players experienced their first airplane rides. Others were away from home for the first time.

This year, Orange NJ sent 18 young players to the Youth NABC. Back home, some of them have



West led a devious ◆3. Zachary won the ◆Q, unblocking the 10, led a spade to the 10 and ace and won the ◆K return with the ace and led a heart to the king and West's queen. Now came the ◆K, pitching a heart, and a spade ruff, a diamond ruff high as West discarded a spade. He then played the fourth spade to discard the last heart from dummy as East ruffed in.

In this ending, East was on lead and declarer had seven tricks.



East led the ◆J. Zachary ruffed high as West discarded his last heart. Zachary had a choice of winning plays but found the most elegant when he ducked a trump to East and scored the ♣A 8 in the ending. His effort held the loss on the deal to 12 IMPs when his teammates went for minus 800 at the other table.




Tricks with trumps

Chip Martel did exceptionally well in the endgame on the deal below from his quarterfinal match in the Spingold by pulling off a nice trump endplay. Martel, of Marty Fleisher's squad, was playing with his team captain against Geoff Hampson and Eric Greco of John Diamond's team.



Hampson started with the ♣Q and continued with the ♣K. Martel ruffed low and tabled the ♦10. Hampson grabbed the ♦A and persisted with a third round of clubs, ruffed in dummy, as Martel shed a heart. When declarer called for dummy's ♦K, Greco ruffed with 8, overruffed by the ♠Q.

Martel next cashed the ♥A K and ruffed a heart as both defenders followed. This was the position:



Declarer has lost two tricks and must hold his trump losers to one to make the contract. On the ◆Q, East refused to ruff, pitching a club instead, as declarer let go of his remaining heart. On the ◆J, East again pitched a club, so Martel ruffed low perforce, although he had a complete count of the hand at that point. East had started with a 4=3=1=5 pattern, so a low trump exit was easy to find. Regardless of which defender won the trick, Martel had the last two with the A-7 positioned over West's 10-x (or equivalent) holding.

Making four, N-S plus 620.

At the other table, Fleisher and Martel's teammates, Joe Grue and Brad Moss, bid 5♣ over 4♠, and were doubled. The contract failed by one trick (plus 100 N-S), so the Fleisher team picked up 11 IMPs.

An open letter by Allan Falk

Twice this week President Ken Monzingo has congratulated the Ethical Oversight Committee for its "courageous" actions as a result of rulings made in two separate matters. Having been in position to observe the Committee throughout six days of hearings, I write to offer my own views of the EOC.

The members of this organization should be both gratified and reassured by the impeccable integrity, attention to detail, willingness to put in hours of preparation, attendance, and deliberation, and utter dedication to fairness displayed by the members of the EOC. Concluding that a charge of ethical misconduct has been proved is not at all a matter of courage, but of weighing evidence and making a judgment. The vast majority of ethical bridge players can take comfort in knowing that, should they ever find themselves accused of wrongdoing before the EOC, the issues will be judged solely on the relevant and probative evidence, and not on personality, reputation, rumor, innuendo, or extraneous considerations of any kind whatsoever. Better still, even if at first blush the evidence appears overwhelming, members of EOC will serially re-examine their preliminary notions, with multiple "devil's advocates" exploring alternative possibilities, and then, only if each conceivable innocent explanation proves unsustainable will a finding of culpability be reported.

Having had the privilege of a front row seat to witness the EOC's work this week, I stand in awe of each member's dedication and devotion to fairness and, above all, to the truth, whatever it may be, and whomever it may discomfit. Anyone who hopes to influence the outcome of an EOC proceeding by pressuring the members to reach a certain conclusion, or by proffering prejudicial but ultimately irrelevant evidence, or in reliance on friendship or favor, will be sorely disappointed. The extreme care to consider every nuance of the evidence before the Committee appeared second nature to the members, but was a perfect reassurance to me that the outcome, whatever it might be, would be unquestionably correct, fair,

unbiased and just.

Exemplary of the EOC members' sense of duty, three came to Washington on their own dime solely to serve at the hearings, playing not a single session of bridge among them. Others put their chances of playing well at an NABC very much at risk by spending long and tiring hours in hearings or reviewing voluminous evidentiary submissions, sapping the mental energy required to play consistently high-level bridge, and likely suffered in consequence. The membership owes these outstanding men and women a debt of gratitude it can never fully repay.

Please join me in taking pride that we as a collective have created such an august and admirable tribunal, and that its members perform their difficult duties in a manner absolutely and irrefutably beyond reproach. Certainly, my hat is off to every member of the Ethical Oversight Committee.
