Huge scores in Open BAM

The team captained by Eric Rodwell posted an impressive 39 out of 52 in the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, but was leading by only a board after two qualifying sessions. Rodwell is playing with Jeff Meckstroth, Bob Hamman and Zia Mahmood.

They finished two qualifying sessions just ahead of the Russ Ekeblad team, who finished with 38. At 37.5 was the squad led by Jacek Pszczola.

Sixty-six teams will play today in the two final sessions. The event started with 130 teams.

Former ACBL chief finds new role in faraway place

Roy G. Green retired from the ACBL in 1998 after six years as chief executive officer, but he and his wife, Mary, have remained active – in bridge and in other aspects of life.

That's especially true of Roy, who for the last four years has been traveling to

Thailand once a year to teach a variety of university courses revolving around banking and finance.

Green had a long career in banking before becoming ACBL's chief executive.

When Green left the ACBL's Memphis headquarters, he and Mary moved to Carlisle, in the Boston area, to be near their daughter, Celia Zimmerman, and her son, Parker.

Since moving to the area, Green has been active

New ACBL President plans focus on grass roots players

Jerry Fleming's first exposure to bridge was in the mid-Sixties while he was a student at the Montana School of Mines in Butte.

One day, he found that just about all the people he hung out with were gathering in the student union each day to play bridge. "They were consumed by it," he recalls. Fleming decided he better learn to play. "It was that or find new friends."

After whizzing through a copy of Alfred Sheinwold's *5 Weeks to Winning Bridge*, Fleming was ready. A bridge career was launched. Four weeks later, he played in a duplicate game at a club in Butte. "After the first time," he says, "I was hooked."

That was the beginning of a long association with bridge for the man who, this past summer, was elected 2009 ACBL president.

Fleming will begin his term with a strong desire to connect with the grass roots players, who make up the vast majority of the ACBL membership.

"I want to get to know the players," he says, "and I want to talk to them and listen to them about their concerns and their ideas for improving the ACBL."

After his introduction to duplicate in Butte, Fleming quickly became involved in politics, first serving on the board of Unit 406 and later as unit president. He also served on the District 18 board.

Of course, Fleming also had a career, working for the Anaconda Minerals Co. in data processing. In 1976, the company transferred him to Grants NM.



The company mined copper in Montana and uranium in New Mexico.

The seven years in Grants, where there was no bridge club, represent a gap in the bridge-playing careers of Fleming and his wife, Marion. The Flemings tried to start a bridge club, but were not successful.

In 1982, Anaconda's plant in Grants closed. In 1984, the family – there are two daughters, Robyn and April – moved again. Fleming, who had earned a master's degree in management from the University of New Mexico, went to work for the Los Alamos National Laboratory, first as a programmer and later as a telecommunications

Shirley was checking their last-round scores with Tom, one of the best players at the club: "I can't believe what I'm seeing," she said. "We scored the same number of tricks on each of the three hands, but your score was three times ours in each case."

"Well," Tom said, motioning to the pair sitting at table one North-South, "we played those against Estelle and Stan. It looks as though you must have opened 1♥ instead of 2NT on the second one. And either you or your partner should double the final contract on the third one—that's what my partner did."

"What about the first board?" Shirley asked. "We were in 1♦ doubled. I can't believe you tripled us on that one. You must have had a 70% game! Don't you get a \$50 prize or something like that?"

"That's right. As long as there are ten or more tables," Tom said.

Well, were there?

In search of the overtrick

A deal that would have absolutely no interest at teams presents a fascinating duel at pairs.

It was played in the first qualifying session of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs,

Let's start with that happened at the table.

Two seeded pairs met up, and South declared 4♥ on the lead of the ♣2 (third and fifth). Declarer won and ruffed off the clubs while drawing trumps. West won an early diamond and shifted to a spade. East won and reverted to diamonds to hold declarer to 420, good for 16 out of 25 matchpoints for the defenders.

The reason the score was so good was that several pairs maneuvered to make North declarer on a top spade lead. But could declarer have done better in the cited case?

Rewind to trick one. Declarer wins the ♣A and leads the ♦K to West's ace. Will that player work out from his partner's card – and should East signal attitude or count? – to shift to a spade? If not, declarer is a tempo ahead. He strips off clubs and trumps, then ends in dummy by cashing his diamonds, reaching this ending:

A low spade from dummy endplays East for the overtrick. Spades are known to be 3-3 from the lead and the diamond carding.

Note: If declarer assumed West was 2=2=4=5 from East's count signals in diamonds, declarer could play the ♠A and another spade for the endplay, a slightly more likely line than playing East for the ♠K Q x x.

Proper technique

This deal from the second qualifying session of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs presents some fine technical points in 6NT (hands rotated).

Dlr: North ♠ J 9 4

Vul: E-W ♥ A 4 2

Say you reach 6NT on a heart lead, the most awkward for you because it potentially damages the entries to dummy.

The way forward is not clear. You cash the ♣A and nothing good happens. Do you play the ♣K and another club? That could be right if East has honor doubleton in the suit. At the table, South guessed well to duck a club at trick two. The defenders won and cleared hearts. When declarer cashed the top clubs, this was the position:

At this point, declarer fell from grace. He crossed to dummy with the ♦K to finesse in diamonds, but he no longer had the communication for a squeeze. Running four spades first leaves declarer in the wrong hand, and cashing only three spades to end in dummy exerts no pressure.

The right line is to use the ♠J as the entry to dummy. Cash three spades, ending in dummy, finesse the ♦J and cash the fourth spade, planning to pitch dummy's heart unless it is good. As the cards lie, this line will squeeze East in diamonds and clubs, but would also exert pressure on West in the unlikely event that he had 1=6=4=2 shape without the ♦Q.

Support your local partner

One of the most understated rules in bridge is to support partner when you have four cards in a suit they have bid. Generally speaking, this tends to work well, even when you have a modest hand. This deal from the Senior Knockout Teams is a good example:

Had North opened 3♦, the auction might have gone 3♠ - 5♦ - 5♠, with South's inevitable double producing a decent penalty despite East-West's 12-card fit.

However, when he opted for the less aggressive alternative of a weak two, East's overcall gave South a problem – which suit should he introduce?

Reasoning that partner was unlikely to have primary heart support South decided to concentrate on the minors by introducing his clubs. When West contented himself with a modest raise, North had an opportunity to support clubs, but rather than opt for a simple 4♣, North went "all in" with a cue bid of 4♠.

From South's point of view, a slam was not impossible, but one minor advantage of being a Senior is that you have had a few extra years to discover that partner's hand has a nasty habit of failing to match your expectations – especially when you are in the slam zone.

West led a spade against 5♣, and declarer won in hand, pitching a heart from dummy. After cashing the top clubs the jack of diamonds ran to East's ace and declarer claimed plus 400.

The auction followed a different course in the other room:

I confess I am amazed that South did not double West's undisciplined 5♠, and a cooperative defense saw declarer escape for one down – and a 5-IMP pickup.



JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

How to improve your game

Someone defined insanity as doing the same thing over and over and expecting a different result. So you're hooked on bridge and have a burning desire to get better. There are a number of ways to improve your game.

Bridge is an experiential game – the more experience, the better. Experience comes in different forms. I inhale the Bridge Bulletin every month. Sometimes the bidding of the world-class players leaves me shaking my head. Some bid on absolutely nothing and yet they land on their feet. There are numerous sections with hints to improve your game and the world's best players and teachers are there to guide you.

Playing at home on the computer is a great way to practice counting. Reading and taking lessons are also excellent.

Of course, there is no substitute for playing, but the work begins after the game is over. One of the best things you can do is analyze your results. After the results are posted, go over to the recap sheet. All your scores are posted and the matchpoints you won on each hand are listed. The pair number goes across the sheet and the board numbers run up and down. Copy the number of matchpoints you won on each board on your convention card. On the recap sheet it will tell you what score is a top on a board. Half that number will be an average score.

Now get a copy of the hand record if they are provided. Look carefully at deals on which you did not score well and also note what you did really well. Are there any common themes to your bad scores? Do you frequently underbid or overbid? Do you do well at trump contracts and poorly at notrump contracts. Remember, your rebid must show your range not your shape.

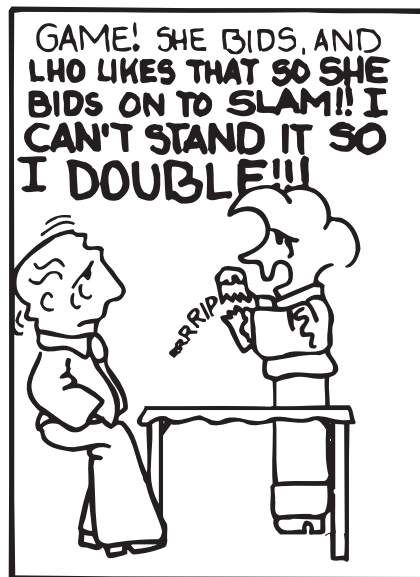
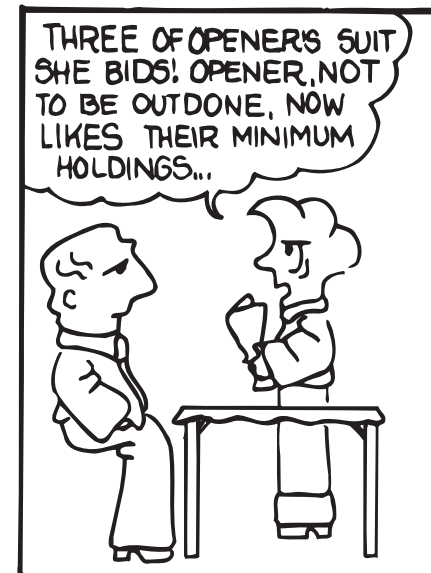
In trump contracts, the first thing you do is count your losers (ex-spouses aren't included) and decide whether to draw trumps. There are several occasions where you must delay drawing trumps. If you need dummy's trumps for ruffing or transportation to a long side suit, don't draw

trumps until you ruff your losers or set up dummy's suit. If you have too many losers and don't have control of the trump suit (if you hold K-Q-J-10-9-8 of the trump suit, you do not have control of the suit) delay drawing trumps until you've gotten rid of one of your losers.

Are notrump contracts the problem? Do you know the rule of seven? Notrump is a race between declarer and the defenders to set up their long suits. The rule of seven tells you how many times to hold up (not win) if you only have one stopper in a suit.

Say dummy has the 7-6 and you hold A-5-2 of the suit that's led. Add the number of cards you have in dummy to the number in your hand and subtract from seven. In this case, you have five between your hand and dummy. Five from seven equals two, so hold up twice. This cuts communication between defenders. If the leader held five cards in the suit, your right-hand opponent will have three and will be unable to return the suit if he is on lead. When do you not use the rule of seven? If you have a weaker suit the defenders may switch to, ignore the rule of seven.

Is defense your weak area? Pay attention to partner's signals. Do you have agreements about leads and discards? If not, discuss them and pay attention. Eventually, every card should have a meaning. One important caveat: Never give

information through your signals that will be more helpful to declarer than partner.

Thinking bridge

Opening lead: ♦3.

Bidding commentary: As North, with this distribution, if you are not strong enough to open 1NT, you are not strong enough to jump raise partner's 1♥ or 1♠ response to 3♥ or 3♠. You must content yourself with a single raise.

Lead commentary: As West, with a choice of two unbid suits to lead, lead the stronger. However, if one of the suits is headed by an ace, lead the other.

Play commentary: As South, considering diamonds in isolation, play low at trick one



hoping West has led from the king. However, looking at the hand as a whole, you should notice that you have a "heart problem" meaning you would rather the opponents lead hearts first. You can force a heart lead by using an equally divided suit (diamonds) as your throw-in suit after the hand has been stripped.

Play commentary #2: Win the ♦A, draw trumps, strip clubs and exit with the ♦Q. No matter who wins the trick, that defender must either lead a heart, limiting your heart losses to two tricks, or concede a ruff and sluff. If given a ruff and sluff, discard a heart from South, the shorter heart hand, and ruff in North, the longer heart hand.

Defensive commentary: Hearts is the critical suit. Whichever side breaks hearts first loses a trick. If declarer misplays the hand and winds up leading hearts first, second hand plays low if a low heart is led and covers if an honor is led.

Quincy Market and Waterfront – Walk over to the waterfront with views of the Rose Kennedy Gardens (atop the 'Big Dig'), Long Wharf and Rowes Wharf and New England Aquarium. Visit the buildings of the former Faneuil Hall produce and meat markets, which have been converted to boutiques, restaurants, and pubs which maintain the historic character of the area.

Beacon Hill – Stroll along Charles Street lined with charming shops and restaurants, including antique browsing. Continue along Mt. Vernon Street and Louisburg Square, Boston's most prestigious address, and Massachusetts State House facing Boston Common and Public Gardens.

in District 25 politics, serving two years as president of the Eastern Massachusetts Bridge Association (Unit 108). He is in the middle of a two-year term as district president.

The adventure in Thailand started four years ago when he took a trip to South Korea, where he served in the U.S. Army.

After Korea, he spent two weeks touring Thailand, leaving the country four days before the tsunami of Dec. 26, 2004, devastated the nation.

Green said that when he heard about the tsunami, he wanted to do something for the country.

"I was so struck with how wonderful the people are and how welcoming they are to Americans and visitors from other countries," Green says, "that I wanted to do something for them. They are the warmest, most gracious people."

Green says he wrote to five different non-profit agencies in Thailand offering his services, and he heard from two colleges.

He is now "CEO in residence" at Mahidol University in Bangkok when he visits for about a month each fall. Green has been teaching banking, finance, U.S. government operations, the Fed and management at the school.

In the last two years, he has also taught at STOU University, a "distance learning" facility that awards recognized degrees through virtual campuses all over Thailand with four-year tuition of \$2000 U.S.

"It's very enjoyable," says Green, "and I really feel that it's a contribution."

These days, when he's home, the Greens are returning to active bridge play now that Mary has overcome some health problems. The two have been married 58 years.

Besides playing, Roy is also teaching the game and notes proudly that at present he has eight classes.

Here is Richard Popper (East) at work on defense. His partner led the ♠5, ducked to Popper's queen. Popper continued with the ♠K even though it set up declarer's jack. This worked particularly well, because this was the full deal:

After the second top spade, the club suit remained blocked. Declarer won the ♠A, unblocked the ♣K and tried to use the ♥Q as an entry to dummy. Down three!

In the other room,, Ken Cohen played 3NT from the North seat on the lead of the ♠K. When Cohen ducked, East shifted to a low diamond. Cohen went up with dummy's ♦K, unblocked clubs and had 10 tricks when clubs split 3-2.

Both vulnerable, it must be right in theory to pass, but who wins pairs events that way?

Playing in the first final of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs, South tried 2♠ (spades and a minor) and played there. The defense started with three rounds of hearts. South ruffed and played a club to the king and ace, winning the club continuation in dummy.

Now a diamond to the king and the ♣J produced this ending when East ruffed:

Alex treated his hand as a reverse, rather than rebidding 2NT, because of the prime cards. 3♣ was forcing, 3♠ suggested a fragment and 4♠ showed a slam-suitable hand with a spade control.

On a spade lead, Alex won in hand and played a heart to the ace, followed by a heart ruff. He then played the ♣A and a club to the king, ruffed a heart, cashed the ♣Q, crossed to the ♠K and gave up a heart, claiming the rest.

If neither clubs nor hearts had behaved, declarer could have taken the diamond finesse, but in practice just making 12 tricks was sure to be good. In fact, plus 1370 was worth 83 of 91 matchpoints.

Make your partner feel bad

We all like to win at bridge, don't we? But how to become a winner then? It starts and ends by assisting your partner's state of mind. But you can take these things too far.

Just ask the unnamed pro who was on lead to 3NT with ♥A Q 10 9 x x and the ♠A.

He led a low heart, and partner produced the jack. Declarer won the king and let the defense back in with the ♣A. Back came a heart, and the pro was about to run the hearts. But before he did so, he remembered Jan's tip: keep things easy for your partner.

Accordingly, after cashing one top heart, the pro thoughtfully cashed the ♠A so that partner would know what to hold.

Disaster! The pro's partner revoked, playing a diamond, thinking his partner had cashed another heart. Now declarer could request a diamond lead. The four winning hearts withered on the vine.

group financial manager. He retired in January of this year.

Fleming and his wife got back into bridge about a year after moving to Los Alamos and he soon was back in bridge politics as well. He was elected to the District 17 board in 1990 and the ACBL board in 1999. At home in Los Alamos, Fleming plays twice a week and directs a game every Thursday.

He sought the presidency for 2009 in part because of the challenge of the position but also because of his interest in the "regular" ACBL players. Fleming says he still remembers his beginnings in duplicate. "I'll never forget the aroma when I walked into the club in Butte," he says. "It was a mixture of perfume and cigarettes."

He also remembers being put straight by one of the players after he assumed that when he bid to 5♠, making it on the nose, he would get a better matchpoint score than those who bid only 4♠, making five.

Besides the grass roots players, Fleming also hopes to focus during his term as president on technological advances, especially regarding the way Swiss teams are scored and the results posted. He would like to see it done electronically so that players are not required to deliver pieces of paper to report match results, then all crowd around a hand-written board to see where they play next.

As president, he hopes to streamline ACBL board meetings and update the organization's strategic plan. Fleming says he would also like to help promote better relations with the World Bridge Federation so that "we can work together for the better of bridge everywhere."

In line with that is the ultimate goal for the Fleming presidency: "I want to be a good ambassador for bridge and the ACBL."

The Green Monster

The *Green Monster* is the nickname of the thirty-seven-foot, two-inch (11.3 m) left field wall – the highest in the majors – at Fenway Park, home to the Boston Red Sox baseball team.

Part of the original ballpark construction of 1912, the wall is made of wood, but was covered in tin and concrete in 1934, and then hard plastic in 1976. Despite the name, the Green Monster was not painted green until 1947. Before that, it was covered with advertisements.

I'm mentioning this because on Saturday I braved the elements to walk over to Fenway Park and take a look at the Monster. I guess it was no surprise when the boards in our subsequent Senior Knockout Teams match proved to be every bit as dramatic as some of the games that have graced the legendary field of play.

As you follow the action, you will see a classic combination of some of the best and worst in bridge, including a few (see if you can spot them) baseball terms – plus you might care to decide who should receive what I will call the Bill Buckner Award for the most disastrous play of the match.

(For non-Bostonians, in 1986, the Boston Red Sox faced the New York Mets in Game 6 of the World Series. Boston led the best-of-7 series 3 games to 2, and had a two-run lead with two outs in the bottom of the tenth inning. New York came back to tie the game with three straight singles off Calvin Schiraldi and a wild pitch by pitcher Bob Stanley. Mookie Wilson fouled off several pitches before hitting a ground ball to Buckner at first base. The ball rolled under Buckner's glove, through his legs, and into right field, allowing Ray Knight to score the winning run, forcing a seventh game, which the Mets won.)

Before I move to the main event try this little brain teaser:

With plenty of entries, how do you play J94 opposite K873 for three tricks?

Assuming North is unwilling to take a gamble and bid a direct 6♥, another approach is to continue with 5♣. Then South has a relatively easy bid of 5♥, which will come as a pleasant surprise to North.

North led the ♣K, and declarer erred significantly by ducking. Now North switched to a trump and declarer was booked for minus 800.

In the other room North-South had an easy time in the regulation game of 3NT, but that only served to hold the loss to 9 IMPs.

Over North's Michaels cuebid, East was able to show a hand with diamonds, but with such poor trumps West was unwilling to do more than jump to game. 5♦ was easy enough, especially as North was almost certain to hold the ♠Q.

As an aside, it's a good idea to have a bid to show a two-suiter after a strong club and a negative response – one easy method is to use double for the majors and 1NT for the minors. Naturally, we had forgotten to discuss this situation.

West led the ♠3, and when declarer called for the king, East won with the ace. It was clear that South's bid was based on a long diamond suit. A heart switch is the only real hope for the defense, and here it would have been very easy for West to switch to the ♠10 when in with the ♥K.

East's decision to exit with a diamond turned out badly, as declarer claimed his contract.

I guess East may eventually be charged with an error.

When our pinch hitter, Rabbi Helman, raised to game, North foolishly went on over 5♦, a contract that would easily have been defeated by a spade lead. I'll come back to the play in a moment.

East led a diamond and West won and switched to clubs, playing the ace and then the queen. When East failed to overtake and give his partner a ruff, declarer could establish a third spade trick and get rid of his club losers.

(The theme is similar to a famous defense where Benito Garozzo switched to a spade from ♠K Q and Pietro Forquet, holding ♠A x x, overtook the queen and gave his partner an essential ruff.) With ♣A Q x, West should not play the queen on the second round, so when he does it must be because he started with ♣A Q alone.

The same mistake was made at the other table, but that was still a game swing to the easy winners of the match.

Before I sign off, here is the solution to the question I posed at the beginning. With plenty of entries how do you play J-9-4 opposite K-8-7-3 for three tricks?

Well, you could take the miniscule chance of running the jack, hoping to pin a singleton 10 on your left. An alternative is to play low to the jack. If

that holds you play one back to the king and then exit with a third round, hoping the queen and ace (as they surely will) appear on this trick.

Impossible do I here you say?

Well, ask Brian Senior, who I watched bring off this coup as dummy a year or two ago!

Interference An infraction where a person illegally changes the course of play from what is expected.

Regulation game A game that ends after nine or more innings with one team winning, or a game called by the umpire after at least five innings have been completed.

Caught stealing A runner is charged, and the fielders involved are credited, with a time when the runner attempts to advance or lead off from one base to another without the ball being batted and then is tagged out by a fielder while making the attempt. A time caught stealing cannot be charged to a batter-runner, that is, a runner who is still advancing as the direct result of reaching base.

Grand slam A home run hit with all the bases occupied, thereby scoring four runs.

Designated hitter Major League Baseball Rule 6.10 that allows teams to designate a player, known as the designated hitter to bat in place of the pitcher.

Cover bases Part of the infielders' job is to stand next to a base in anticipation of receiving the ball thrown from another fielder, so that they may make a play on an opposing baserunner who is approaching that base.

Bullpen The area where relief pitchers warm up before entering a game.

Player to be named later The player to be named later is generally used to postpone a trade's final conditions or terms. In 1962, when Harry Chiti was traded to the New York Mets from the Cleveland Indians for a PTBNL, and the teams could not agree on a final deal within the six-month timeframe, the PTBNL was, oddly enough, Harry Chiti.

Error A fielder misplaying a ball in a manner that allows a batter or baserunner to reach one or more additional bases, when such an advance should have been prevented given ordinary effort by the fielder.

Pinch hitter A substitute batter.

Revenge at trick one

Playing against Jay Borker on the first night of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs, I held the East cards on this deal (hands rotated):

♠ 10 8 3 7 5 2	♠ —

On a quantitative auction, Jay reached 6NT by South. My partner, David Berkowitz, tried to make a safe lead – the ♣6. Not so safe, it turns out. Declarer played low from dummy and I falsecarded with the queen. Declarer still had several ways to succeed in his contract, but he thought the lead was from either J-9-6 or 9-6-x-x (we lead second-highest from low cards). After a diamond to the king and a winning diamond finesse, declarer got the clubs wrong and went down one. Had I played a "normal" ♣9 at trick one, it would have been easy for declarer to read the suit. He'd have gone to dummy to lead another club (through my Q J) to take three club tricks. Experts may note that the contract can make on any lead if declarer plays for a minor-suit squeeze against East. Revenge was just around the corner. The next day, in the final, we played the same pair on this deal (hands rotated):

We reached 3NT by South. West had overcalled 1♠ (!) against our big club and Jay, with the East cards, had gotten to make a lead-directing double of spades. When a low spade was led, declarer "knew" not to waste the jack. He played low from dummy and Jay falsecarded with the king. Declarer won the ace and played a low diamond from hand at trick two. West won and played the ♠10. How could declarer possibly get this right? He put up the jack and was dismayed to see it lose to the queen. A heart came back to the ace and the spades were run for down two. (Even without the falsecard, declarer

might have failed, but it was still amusing to see.) The nightly falsecard show ended up break even – both times the falsecarder got a near-top on the board. It doesn't always pay to be honest.

Defensive brilliance or declarer error?

Jim Priebe of the Toronto area shared the following deal from Saturday's round of the Senior Knockouts. Priebe was playing with team captain Lew Richardson, also of Toronto, in their match against the squad led by Hansa Narasimhan, playing here with Eddie Wold. Despite losing the match, Priebe and Richardson enjoyed a net swing of 15 IMPs on this layout:

Richardson began with a fourth-best ♥2. Dummy's jack held the trick (Priebe, East, unblocking the 10), and a spade to declarer's jack also held. Wold then played the ♠K from the closed hand, which Priebe ducked again.

Double dummy, declarer can prevail at this point by cashing dummy's top clubs and playing a heart to the king. West can win, but with only red cards remaining, must put declarer back on lead to cash the long club and the high heart. That would give declarer nine tricks with two spades, two hearts, four clubs and a diamond trick on power.

Wold, however, played the ♥K at trick four, allowing the defenders to execute a pretty finish. Richardson refused the trick, and after the ♣AKQ were cashed, Richardson also ducked the ♦K continuation. Wold tried the effect of the ♦10 next, covered all around. West cashed the ♥A and underled the ♦9 to East's 8, allowing Priebe to take the ♠AQ for down one.

At the other table, North-South were in a less aggressive 2NT making three. The Richardson team won 5 IMPs on the deal instead of losing 10 had declarer succeeded in 3NT.

Bridge players needed for university study

You are invited to participate in a Harvard University research study in conjunction with the Boston NABC. The study, which takes approximately 15 minutes, involves taking a bridge quiz designed by famed bridge expert Michael Rosenberg, two-time ACBL Player of the Year, winner of 14 North American Championships and World Grand Master.

Multiple prizes of \$250 or better will be awarded in different masterpoint categories, plus additional winners selected at random.

The study will be conducted at the Westin on Tuesday, Nov. 25, immediately outside the America Ballroom on the fourth floor. Two tables and large posters will identify the experiment location. Interested players may participate from 11:45 a.m. until 12:45 p.m. (15 minutes before game time), or immediately after the afternoon session, or from 6:15 till 7:15 p.m. (15 minutes before evening game time).

Participants will also be asked to provide a sample of genetic material through a mouthwash sample. The general hypothesis of the research is that some genetic markers correlate with bridge bidding propensities. All responses, include mouthwash samples, will be recorded anonymously.

Once the study is completed on Wednesday, the answers to the quiz will be distributed, as well as a detailed explanation of the study's purpose. All results from the study will be reported on an aggregate basis, e.g., players with fewer than 200 masterpoints tended to bid 3NT on a particular hand. Final results from the study will be posted on a public website, and submitted to a major bridge publication.

This study is overseen by Richard Zeckhauser, the Frank Plumpton Ramsey Professor of Political Economy at Harvard University.

Answers to Daily Bridge Puzzle on page 2

Yes, there were at least 10 tables, assuming a normal movement. On the first board, East-West were non-vulnerable, and Shirley got 240 for 1♦ doubled, making two, while Tom got 720 for 1♥ redoubled, also making two. On the second board, Shirley got 230 for 1♥, making six, while Tom got 690 for 3NT, making six, meaning that East-West were vulnerable. On the third board, Shirley beat a contract two tricks for plus 100, while Tom beat the same contract, doubled, by two tricks, for plus 300.

A sequence of three boards with East-West non-vulnerable, East-West vulnerable, and North-South non-vulnerable doesn't happen until boards 28-30 or 31-33.

Double duck and a little luck

Betty Ann Kennedy and Lynn Deas won the four-session Smith Life Master Women's Pairs last weekend. Their margin of victory was in excess of three boards, some of which came from the skill of the winners, while some came from friendly opponents. On this deal (rotated) from the first final session, both factors were in evidence, as Kennedy and Deas collected 30.5 out of 31 matchpoints:

South opened 1♦ and jumped to 2NT after North's 1♠ response. North tried 3♥ and South's 3NT ended the auction.

Kennedy, West, led a Rusinow ♣9. Deas, East played the king in case her partner had led from A-10-9 or Q-10-9. Declarer won the ace and played a spade to dummy's queen, as both defenders ducked.

There are many ways for declarer to finish with 10 tricks at this point, either by working on diamonds or by taking the right view in hearts, but at this table, declarer took a losing heart finesse into the West hand. Kennedy exited passively with a heart, and declarer can still come to 10 tricks with careful play. On the run of the hearts, however, declarer released a diamond, holding herself to nine tricks.

The recap sheet shows that most declarers scored 11 tricks, however, when a defender rose with a spade honor on the first round of the suit.
