Katz estimated that things were going so badly that their session was probably two boards below average after the first 14 deals.

Demirev showed excellent judgment in pulling the penalty double – there were 790s all over the room for 4♥ doubled, making.

West started with the ♥4, and Demirev inserted dummy's queen, ruffing when East produced the king. He played a diamond to dummy's 9, cashed the ♥A, pitching a club, then ruffed dummy's last heart.

Another diamond put him in dummy, and he played a spade to his 10. West won the ♠J and got out with the ♣Q. East won the ♣A and continued the suit. Demirev won the ♣K and played the ♠K

from hand. When West played low, Demirev discarded one of dummy's two remaining clubs. He later conceded a club and ruffed one in dummy for plus 600, which was good for 83.5 out of 90 matchpoints.

Demirev's leap to the club slam was based on his assumption that Katz had working cards for his move past 3NT.

He took the opening lead of the ♥Q with the ace, ruffed a heart, played the ♣A and a club to the king, ruffed a third heart, played a spade to the king and ruffed again with the ♣Q. That established East's ♣J as a winner, but Demirev had 12 tricks. He was able to cash his two high spades, discarding a diamond from dummy. The defenders got only the ♣J. Plus 1370 was worth 80 of 90 matchpoints.

On this deal from the Fenway Park Daylight Open Pairs on Saturday, West had reason to rue his choice of opening leads against a slam. Brett Adler of Westport CT made the opponents pay for the error (hands rotated). Adler was playing with Glenn McIntyre of Bedford MA.

With the 1♣ opener on his right, West should have steered clear of a club lead altogether, but it was the longest and strongest suit. Had declarer started with a low club, there might have been no story, but the opening thrust was the ♣9, which proved fatal.

Adler, South, put in dummy's jack, which held as East pitched a low spade. Adler cashed the ♠A and played a spade to his jack, followed by a low club from hand. West inserted the ♣9 to force the king, but now the ♣6 drove out the queen.

Adler was up to 11 tricks at that point – four clubs, two top diamonds, three spades and two top hearts – so a simple squeeze against East was going to work, but East discarded diamonds on all the clubs, so Adler actually had a double squeeze, with the ♦7 in dummy operating as a threat against West. Plus 990 was a cold top and helped Adler and McIntyre to fifth overall in the event.

It's a bidder's game

It doesn't matter how good your declarer skills are if you're not in the right contract. Bidding is learning a foreign language. As you develop your skills, you will add conventions that will help elicit information from partner. However, you need a solid understanding of the basics before you start adding sophisticated gadgets to your repertoire.



In any auction, the idea is to find the proper level and the right denomination. Usually it is best to seek out an eight-card major-suit fit. If the first two bids are suit bids at the one level, we know very little about where this auction is headed.

Let's say you open 1♣ and partner responds 1♠. All we know of opener is that he has at least 12 or 13 high-card points and three or more clubs. Responder has at least 6 HCP and four spades. Opener may have 16 points and six clubs and responder may have five spades and 14 HCP. You will not know until later in the auction.

Both opener's and responder's rebids are value bids. You must tell partner if you are in the minimum, medium or maximum range. Many times you may not bid your shape in order to tell your partner what is your range.

Opener's three ranges are minimum, 13-16; medium, 17-18, and maximum, 19 or more.

Responder's three ranges are 6 to a bad 10; medium, 11-12, and maximum 13 or more.

The mantra for minimum hands for both opener and responder is, "Rebid your suit, rebid partner's suit or rebid 1NT." Opener has one more options. If his second suit is of a lower denomination, he may bid that suit at the two level. For example, in the following auction:

1♥ - Pass - 1♠ - Pass; 2♣, we know opener most likely has five hearts, four clubs and a minimum or medium hand.

Okay, before going on take two aspirin, this is going to hurt.

Suppose the auction goes this way:

1♥ - Pass - 1♠ - Pass; 2♣ - Pass - 2♥.

How many points and how many hearts does responder have?

Responder has 6-9 points and exactly two hearts. This is responder's hand.

- ♠ K 9 8 7 6
- ♥ 7 4
- ♦ K J 7 6 5
- ♣ 8 6

After partner responds 2♣ showing five hearts, four clubs and a non-maximum, you may not bid your shape. Remember the mantra. With a minimum, rebid your suit, rebid partner's suit or rebid 1NT. These are your only options. If you bid 2♦ now and partner bids either 2NT or 3NT, they will have to call the director because after the opening lead you won't want to put dummy on the table.

You hold:

- ♠ K 9 8 7 6
- ♥ 7 4 3
- ♦ K J 7 6
- ♣ 8 6

Partner opens 1♥. Your bid is 2♥. To paraphrase the bandit in Treasure of Sierra Madre, "We don't need no stinking spades in this auction." It's not often you can describe your hand in one bid. This bid tells partner you have at least three-card support and 6-9 points, perfect. The previous auction is just taking a false preference because you have no other bid.

With a minimum response versus a minimum opener, stop as soon as possible. With a medium hand, invite to game, With a maximum, get to the right game.

An auction such as this usually ends with a double.

One important note, a rebid of 2NT by responder is always invitational. If you play that a response of 2NT to a minor is 13 to 16 points, this is an entirely different auction.

Responder has 11-12 points. A rebid of 1NT would show 6 to a bad 10 points, 2NT 11-12 and a jump to 3NT is 13 or more.

Opening lead: ♠6.

Bidding commentary: As South, you have a borderline raise to 2♠. As East, your 2♦ in competition shows 10 or more high-card points and is not a game-force, but your trick taking potential is enough to raise to 3NT after partner's non-forcing 2NT bid (13-14 HCP).

Play commentary: As West, take the first trick with the ♠K, not the ace. North knows you have the ♠A K from South's play of the ♠J, but South can't be sure what's going on if you win the king. South may think you have K-Q-x or



K-x-x. If you win the ♠A, South may smell a rat. If your only stopper is the ace, why no hold up play? Bottom line: With an A-K stopper at notrump, take the first trick with the king; at a suit contract try the ace.

Defensive commentary: As North,

after winning the ♦A, you can count declarer for at least nine tricks outside of hearts: five

diamonds, two spades and two clubs, minimum. To entertain any hope of defeating the contract, shift to a low heart (the 3), looking for four heart tricks.

Defensive commentary: #2: As South, when partner shifts to a low heart, showing strength, win the ♥A, return the ♥2. Your side will rattle off four heart tricks. Down one. If partner had wanted a spade return, partner would have shifted to a high heart, showing weakness in the suit.

Multi, DC style

Gradually, the Multi 2♦ opening, showing a weak two in one of the majors, is gaining popularity on this side of the ocean. Nowadays, quite a few American expert pairs tend to make use of this in original British bidding device.

Talking about the Multi, in the Seniors Knockout Teams round of 32, we played against a strong team from the DC area. After two sessions, the match was tight (we trailed by 6 IMPs). Board 1 of the third session, gave us good hopes. It had everything to do with a small but interesting agreement on competitive Multi auctions.

(2) North to East: "If you bid 3NT, my partner is obliged to double when his suit is hearts."

I never heard of this agreement, but its merits are obvious: to discover the right lead. Of course the 3♣ bidder should have spade tolerance as well because once in a while you have to play spades at the three level. Same applies to 2♦- 2NT - 3♦ asking to double 3NT when spades is the long suit.

Here the delicate approach by North-South backfired. With the ♣Q in South, East-West bid and made game on thin values. The rest of the match turned out to be disastrous. You can read more about it in Mark Horton's "The Green Monster," published in yesterday's Daily Bulletin.

Matchpoint dilemma

IMPs is a such a simple game, in the sense that as defender or declarer you always know what your primary goal is – to do the best you can to defeat their contract or make yours. Matchpoints is a far more complex game, where it is sometimes correct to just cash out on defense and give up on any hope of defeating the contract or, as declarer, to risk your contract in pursuit of overtricks. What would be your decision on this deal from the LM Pairs second qualifying session? South deals, North-South are vulnerable.

The deal featured Michael Seamon as declarer. South led the ♦7 (fourth best) to the jack and queen. Mike cashed the ace and king of clubs, South following with the 3 then the jack and North the 4 then the 8, playing standard carding. Two rounds of hearts saw South follow with the jack then throw a spade. Now what?

If diamonds were 6-1, North would have the ♣J and the suit could be cleared safely after cashing the heart winners and 11 tricks made. And didn't South, who had bid 2♠ at adverse vulnerability, rate to be 6-4?

Well, the alternative was to cash the hearts and take the marked spade finesse to ensure nine tricks and the contract. After much soul searching, Mike settled for those nine tricks, just as he would have done as a matter of routine at IMPs. Did he do right?

This was the full deal:

Yes indeed, clearing the clubs would have resulted in down one. For me, pairs is the more interesting and rewarding form of the game because so many deals that would be routine at IMPs throw up fascinating decisions, just like the one shown here.

How to get your name in the newspaper

During the second qualifying session of the Mitchell Open Board-a-Match Teams, Alex Ornstein had the opportunity to make a master play. He grabbed it with both hands. This was the deal (hands rotated):

On my uninspired lead of the ♥7, declarer played low and Alex played the king. South could do no better than take the club finesse. Note: running the queen is the right play in this case because West is far more likely to have three clubs to the king-10 than the singleton king.

At any rate, Alex won the ♣K and shifted to the ♠J – curtains for declarer. His logic was that if I had led a heart from three low cards with what clearly was a four-card spade suit, then I must have the ♠A Q, and unless I had the ♠10 nothing could help our cause.

It's worth noting that at another table, Phillip Alder made the same opening lead, and his partner, Mark Horton, also put up the ♥K. When declarer played a low club to the jack, Horton won his king and made the same killing switch to the ♠J. Well done, Alex and Mark.

Put 'em out

Smoking is not permitted in either of the host hotels at the Boston NABC. This is not only a matter of Marriott and Westin policy, but also of ACBL regulation.

Players found smoking (even in stairwells and emergency exits) near any of the playing areas are subject to scoring penalties.

If you want to smoke, please step outside.



So many matches, so little time

I never said I was perfect, but do I have to make so many mistakes? This deal (hands rotated) comes from the second final session of the Nail Life Master Open Pairs.

Dlr: East ♠ J 7 2

Say you upgrade the South hand and reach 3NT after West has shown spades. On a low spade lead, you make your first (in theory fatal?) error in putting up the jack. You duck the ♠Q and the ♠K, and West joins in the inaccuracy by following with the ♠3 — playing the 10 for a heart shift is better.

Now comes a diamond switch, and you duck. West wins the ♦Q and you instinctively follow low. As you do so, you have that sinking feeling — you should have unblocked the ♦10 from dummy. This is the ending when the ♠10 comes back:

At this point, declarer has a shrewd idea that the ♦J is on his right. But should he play for diamonds to be 3-3 or clubs to be 3-3? Inasmuch as I solidly misguessed the play at every turn, you won't be surprised that I got that wrong, too. I led a club to the queen, ran the ♦10 but lost the last two tricks.

Had I unblocked the ♦10 on the first round of the suit, I would have been able to cash four rounds of clubs and run the diamonds via the finesse without a guess.

Blocking play

By Mark Horton

In American football, blocking is a legal move occurring when one player obstructs another player's path with his body. The purpose of blocking is to prevent defensive players tackling the ball carrier, or to protect the quarterback, in the pass, in the backfield hand-off to other backs, or when the quarterback attempts to run (rush) with the ball himself.

Blocking play is also a legal move in bridge, but whilst it can be a great move for declarer, it is generally something to be avoided by the defenders.

(You may recall an excellent series of books by Terence Reese and Roger Trezel, one of which was entitled *Blocking, Unblock and Safety Plays in Bridge*.)

This combination came up in the Senior Knockout Teams:

Defending a notrump contract, if you start this suit by leading the 7 or 2 and the first trick is completed by the 10, jack and ace, make sure the next time you lead from the North hand you play the 9. Otherwise, when declarer puts up the queen and South wins with the king you will be in the way.

This spectacular example of what might be the bridge equivalent of bridge hari-kari comes from the BAM Teams:

South's tactical move in the bidding did not appear to have turned out too well when West produced the two of hearts at trick one. A delighted East decided to put up the ace, and continued with the queen. When West failed to overtake the heart suit was fatally blocked.

Lombardo said he has been gratified in noting that people from all over New England have pitched in to help make the Fall NABC a memorable tournament.

Jay Baum, ACBL's chief executive, also praised the organizers, "for making our jobs so easy." Baum noted that ACBL membership is up and continues to grow, "and the reason for that is goodwill."

Osofsky acknowledged members of the ACBL board who are leaving after years of service — Jonathan Steinberg in District 2, Sue Himel in District 14, Roger Smith in District 21 and Corinne and Jim Kirkham in District 22.

Elaine Said, who lives in Nashville, told a story about Green, who lately has taken up bridge teaching. She said her experience is that in a typical class there are dropouts before the course is complete, sometimes as many as half. Said said she was amazed to hear Green report that in eight bridge classes he has had no dropouts.

Attendees also heard a report on the youth bridge activities at the 1st World Mind Sports Games in Beijing, China, last month. David Sabourin, a young player from Canada who participated in China, said the experience for him was "all about friendships," and he said he was surprised to find out that there are "so many people behind the scenes" in the running of a tournament.

Osofsky recognized ACBL medal winners in Beijing — Kevin Dwyer, winner of Group C in the Youth Individual; Reese Milner, Grant Baze, Matt Granovetter, Billy Eisenberg, Sam Lev and Russ Ekeblad, silver medalists in the Senior International Cup, and Sylvia Moss, Judin Radin, Mildred Breed, Janice Seamon-Molson, Tobi Sokolow and Marinesa Letizia, bronze medalists in the Women's Teams.

Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs

In last year's Blue Ribbon Pairs, the top-tier U.S. partnership of Steve Landen and Pratap Rajadhyaksha charged from behind to win the six-session contest by less than half a board. As partners for more than 26 years, the duo has posted several high-level wins. The 2007 victory in the Blue Ribbon also helped make up for their second-place finish in 2001, a contest they were leading until a last-round revoke by Pratap, which cost them the title.

In second place last year were Argentinians Ernesto Muzzio and Alejandro Bianchedi.

The event

The Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs ranks with the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs as one of the most prestigious — and toughest — pair events on the ACBL calendar. Like the LM Pairs, the Blue Ribbon Pairs is played over three days and includes two qualifying, two semifinal and two final sessions.

Entry is restricted to winners and runners-up in regional championships — plus high finishers in North American championships, members of current Grand National district championship teams, members of current official teams representing ACBL and the top 100 lifetime masterpoint holders.

The Blue Ribbon Pairs was renamed the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs in 1999 to honor one of bridge's all-time great players, writers, administrators and the authority on the laws of the game.

Kaplan (1925-1997) won his first North American championship in 1953 — the Vanderbilt — and his last in 1997 — the Open Swiss Teams at the Spring NABC in Dallas.

Kaplan was recognized as the world's foremost authority on the laws of duplicate and rubber bridge. He became co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission in 1978 and was co-chairman of the WBF Laws Commission at the time of his death.

He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1993. In 1995 he was inducted into the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame and the WBF Hall of Fame.

The trophy

The event is contested for the Cavendish Trophy, awarded for the National Open Pair Championship and donated by the Cavendish Club of New York in 1928. Since 1963, the trophy has been awarded to winners of the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

Noting the adverse vulnerability, I jokingly commented to North, my right-hand opponent, "You're probably sitting there with 10 points, waiting for me to balance.

After I passed, however, and partner made the opening lead, the dummy came down and everyone laughed to see 10 points in the North hand! North (dummy) apologized to his partner for not seeing the ♠A in his hand. He was soon apologizing to us, however, for the limit of the deal was eight tricks for North-South: At all the other tables, the contract was 3NT down one! The full deal:

When using bid boxes, ACBL suggests that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

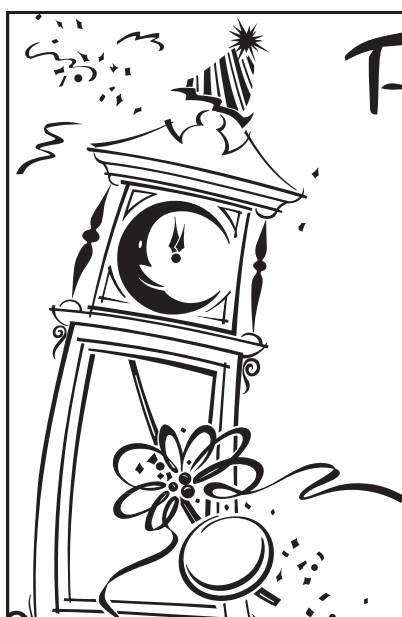
When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word — such as "transfer" — and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

Bridge players needed for university study

You are invited to participate in a Harvard University research study in conjunction with the Boston NABC. The study, which takes approximately 15 minutes, involves taking a bridge quiz designed by famed bridge expert Michael Rosenberg, two-time ACBL Player of the Year, winner of 14 North American Championships and World Grand Master.

Multiple prizes of \$250 or better will be awarded in different masterpoint categories, plus additional winners selected at random.

The study will be conducted at the Westin on Tuesday, Nov. 25, immediately outside the America Ballroom on the fourth floor. Two tables and large posters will identify the experiment location. Interested players may participate from 11:45 a.m. until 12:45 p.m. (15 minutes before game time), or immediately after the afternoon session, or from 6:15 till 7:15 p.m. (15 minutes before evening game time).

Participants will also be asked to provide a sample of genetic material through a mouthwash sample. The general hypothesis of the research is that some genetic markers correlate with bridge bidding propensities. All responses, include mouthwash samples, will be recorded anonymously.

Once the study is completed on Wednesday, the answers to the quiz will be distributed, as well as a detailed explanation of the study's purpose. All results from the study will be reported on an aggregate basis, e.g., players with fewer than 200 masterpoints tended to bid 3NT on a particular hand. Final results from the study will be posted on a public website, and submitted to a major bridge publication.

This study is overseen by Richard Zeckhauser, the Frank Plumpton Ramsey Professor of Political Economy at Harvard University.

Scott was also very quick. Once, in a club game, I opened 1NT with a 3=4=4=2 16-count (we were playing strong notrumps at the time) and he raised to 3NT. I happened to glance at my hand before making my routine pass and noticed that both of my four-card red suits were hearts. So I

bid 4♥. One of the opponents asked what I had and he answered, "He must have had two four-card red suits that turned out to be hearts." By Bill Reich.
