Fu, Li win Women's Pairs

Fu Bo and Li Hanxiao of Shanghai, China, are the new Whitehead Women's Pairs champions. The duo, who won Tuesday's qualifying round, scored 61.08% in the first final session and 59.15% in the second final to convincingly win the contest by more than three boards. Their four-session total with carryover was 859.12 (25 top).

In second with 771.62 were Liping Wang and Yang Jinghui of Beijing, China. The pair made a strong move in the final: After they qualified 49th in the opening round, the pair posted a 66% game in the first final session.

For the winners, this was the first NABC title for Li – indeed, it was her first appearance at an NABC – but the second for Fu, who was a member of the

World Bridge-Bot Championship



The 23rd annual World Computer-Bridge Championship started on Monday, with seven bridge bots competing for the title. The ACBL and World Bridge Federation sponsor the event, run by organizer Al Levy. Follow the action on https://bridgebotchampionship.com/ where you will also see all past championship results, as well as interesting articles on bot play.

The entries are truly international, including defending champion Wbridge5 (France), last year's runner-up Synrey Bridge (China), Micro Bridge (Japan), Q-Plus Bridge (Germany), RoboBridge (The Netherlands), Meadowlark Bridge (USA) and TCS BridgeBot (India).

Each entry plays as a team of four identical

Celebrities wanted for charitable videos

Bridge celebrities are sought for a new project that will raise money for organizations that support bridge. Hall of Famers, world champions, national champions and celebrities are asked to participate in the effort, which will contribute to the ACBL Educational Foundation, the U.S. Bridge Federation and the Foundation for the Advancement and Preservation of Bridge.

Renowned teacher Patty Tucker will have a film crew in Columbus recording 5-minute videos of the participants for a series of "Bridge Chats From the Masters." The videos will be sold in bundles of 20 for \$10 on Vimeo, a streaming platform.

"I thought, what if we created a page where we let people here what the experts have to say?" Tucker said. That page is *vimeo*. com/ondemand/

More than 30 top players have already signed up, and Tucker expects to film twice that many in

C. Bruce Elliott 1922-2019



Bruce Elliott, a four-time NABC champion and member of the Canadian Hall of Fame, died Oct. 3. Elliott, 97, was Life Master No. 228.

A lifelong resident of the Toronto area, Elliott became a Life Master in 1950. His partnership with Percy Sheardown was one of the best

in North America in the 1950s and '60s, and their team with Eric Murray and Sami Kehela ranks as the

best Canadian foursome of all time.

Elliott won the Chicago Trophy (now the Reisinger) in 1948, playing with Agnes Gordon, the first of his four major North American titles. He won the Chicago Trophy again in 1951, playing with Percy Sheardown. With Sheardown, Kehela and Murray, he won the 1964 Spingold Master Knockout Teams, and the foursome successfully defended the title in 1965, becoming the only foursome to date to achieve such a feat.

Elliott represented Canada twice in the World Team Olympiad, winning a bronze medal in Deauville, France, in 1968.

Elliott is survived by wife Maggie (the couple was married for 66 years) and their three sons: Ian (Calgary AB), Scott (Fredericton NB) and Craig (Nobleton ON).

Blass meets Nickell in today's Soloway final

The final of the inaugural Soloway KO Teams will feature a battle between two superstar squads: Josef Blass npc and Nick Nickell.

In yesterday's semifinal round, Blass (Jacek Pszczola, Jacek Kalita, Michal Nowosadzki, Sjoert Brink and Sebastiaan Drijver) defeated Warren Spector's team (Gavin Wolpert, Vincent Demuy, John Kranyak, John Hurd and Joel Wooldridge) 135-113. Blass jumped out to an early lead in the match which they never relinquished.

In the other bracket, Nickel (Ralph Katz, Jeff Meckstroth, Eric Rodwell, Robert Levin and Steve Weinstein) had an exceptionally close match against Andrew Rosenthal and company (Aaron Silverstein, Chris Willenken, Jan Jansma, Boye Brogeland and Christian Bakke), but pulled away in the last quarter to advance 93-75.

Hampson, Greco take lead in Blue Ribbon Pairs

Boosted by a 63% game in the first semifinal session, Geoff Hampson and Eric Greco moved to the top of the leader list in the Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs as today's final round begins. Hampson and Greco, who qualified fifth after Tuesday's opening round, paired their nice first session on Wednesday with a 54.45% game in the evening session to take the lead.

In second are Ron Gerard and Adam Wildavsky of New York, while Australian Peter Gill and partner Iain Sime of Scotland are in third place.

Clayton, Cohn lead Mini-Blue quals

With a pair of 60% games in Wednesday's semifinal round, Phil Clayton of Frisco TX and Jonathan Cohn of Gillette WY took the lead in the 0-6000 Mini-Blue Ribbon Pairs. The pair moved to first from ninth after Tuesday's opening round.

In second are Leila Sink of Los Gatos CA and John Hoffman of Mountain View CA.

Third place is occupied by the Seattle-based pair of Jeffrey Ford and Aaron Mohrman.

Myalgic Encephalomyelitis:

A highly debilitating disease that affects many more people than you realize

In the late '70s, if your son, daughter or grandchild had been chronically ill since age 7, suffering inexplicable pain, fatigue, and a myriad of physiological symptoms despite seeking the best medical care available in the Southeast, you'd probably understand why he/she might have chosen to move to San Francisco in hopes of finding desperately-needed medical treatment on the "cutting-edge" West Coast. Cindy Siegel (Shepler) lived and loved her new life in the City by the Bay and relentlessly pursued medical answers while there. By 1993, in her mid-30s, the lack of adequate treatment forced her to leave a successful life and career in the healthcare industry and return to her hometown of Knoxville.

In 1997, Cindy took up duplicate bridge and loved the competition. However, in 2008, she had to quit playing due to progressively increasing fatigue and eye strain. Over the years, she's even had to withdraw from a monthly social game and is now mostly homebound. Cindy finds it sadly ironic that she left her hometown as a young woman with big dreams, only to find herself much older, sicker, and back in Knoxville, unable to travel, especially to the city she once called home. Still a member of ACBL and a cheerleader for her bridge-playing husband, Cindy misses bridge dearly.

Cindy has now been ill for 55 years and is not alone. It is estimated that more than one million Americans – perhaps up to 2.5 million – are afflicted with this devastating disease called myalgic encephalomyelitis, also known as chronic fatigue syndrome, or ME/CFS. You can be sure that it affects many bridge families; both authors of this article have daughters afflicted with ME/CFS. Bev's daughter, ill for 14 years but not diagnosed until three years ago, is homebound and must close her eyes when riding in a car because the visual stimulation

is overwhelming. Art's daughter, ill for 15 years, is fortunate to be in graduate school, but has a live-in caretaker because she lacks sufficient energy to take care of her daily needs and adhere to the rigorous demands of graduate studies.

ME/CFS is characterized by profound fatigue, cognitive dysfunction, sleep abnormalities, pain, and other symptoms that are made worse by exertion of any sort. Something as simple as brushing your teeth can cause a crash. Twenty-five percent of people with ME/CFS are bed-bound or homebound, and 35-69% are unable to work. ME/CFS onset often follows a viral infection or some other bodily stress. People with ME/CFS have a lower quality of life and higher rate of disability than those with HIV/AIDS, multiple sclerosis, diabetes, and rheumatoid arthritis. The cause of the disease is unknown, and there is no FDA-approved treatment.

Less than one-third of medical schools cover ME/CFS in their core curriculum; hence, most physicians are not familiar with the disease. Consequently the vast majority of patients are undiagnosed or misdiagnosed, and with fewer than two dozen ME/CFS specialists nationwide, many cannot obtain treatment.

For over 30 years, ME/CFS was thought to be a psychogenic disease. Then in 2015 the National Academy of Medicine issued a comprehensive report that declared ME/CFS to be physically-based. Despite the definitiveness of that report, the disease remains stigmatized, and incorrect and harmful treatment recommendations still exist on (otherwise) reputable medical websites.

Persuading our government to treat ME/CFS with the urgency that it deserves has been challenging. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has referred to ME/CFS as America's Hidden Health Crisis, yet their outreach campaign to medical entities

has lacked urgency. Open Medicine Foundation, an NGO based in California, funds research at institutions such as Stanford and Harvard. We hope that privately funded research, as well as advocacy efforts by organizations, such as The ME Action Network, will encourage the National Institutes of Health to increase its ME/CFS research funding, which is currently less than 10% that of similarly burdensome diseases.

To the bridge community – we need your understanding and help. Please be aware of this devastating disease and show compassion when you encounter people who have it – they are most likely much more ill than you realize. And when you have the opportunity, please let your healthcare providers and government officials know that people with ME/ CFS desperately need their help.

Take All Your Chances



North (Dummy)

- **♦** K 8
- ♥AKQ9
- ♦ J 8 7 6
- **♣**954

South (You)

- **♠** A Q 6
- ♥ J 10 5
- **♦** 10 9 3
- ♣ A Q 7 2



You open 1♣ and rebid 1NT over partner's 1♥ response. Partner boosts you to 3NT, and the opening lead is the ♠2 (fourth best). Plan the play.

With spades apparently 4-4, the safe line with eight

top tricks is to develop a ninth in diamonds, not clubs. Why diamonds? Given a normal lie of cards, you will lose three diamonds and a spade. If you try for two club tricks instead, you must find the ♣K with East (50%). Nor can you try for 3-3 clubs, because you will have to give up the lead twice and the opponents can take three diamond tricks.

The full deal:

Win the \bigstar K in dummy and lead a low diamond to the 10 and continue playing diamonds each time you are in. Assuming spades are 4-4, you will lose three diamonds and one spade not having to rely on a miracle club holding.

Tip: If you have ample time, develop tricks in suits that have inevitable losers, suits missing an ace, an ace-king, or even an ace-king-queen. Why increase your sure loser count by attacking other suits? Play like an expert.

Parking

Parking is difficult in San Francisco. The Marriott offers valet parking only, for \$79.99 a day. There is a municipal parking garage on Mission between Fourth and Fifth streets. Rates are \$3/hour, with a \$34 daily maximum.

Restrictions for certain events in 2020

Players should be aware of the following decision by the ACBL Board of Directors which will take effect in 2020.

Any player who has won a contest that carries ACBL Grand Life Master eligibility (most open NABC contests or equivalent events such as world championship titles or the U.S./Canadian team trials) will be treated as if they possess at least 10,000 masterpoints (if they haven't already acquired that total) for the purposes of flighting, stratification and KO bracketing. Essentially, anyone who has won an open NABC title can't play in a masterpoint-restricted event, including the so-called "10K" events at NABCs, where participation is limited to players with less than 10,000 points.

Additionally, the ACBL Seeding Committee has updated the eligibility points of many players, especially those from outside North American, which may alter player seeding points for top-level events. Email notifications of these changes will be sent to players in January.

STEM contacts needed

The ACBL Educational Foundation is searching for ACBL members who have may have contacts with national STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics) accreditation bodies. The Ed Foundation's plan is to create bridge modules that can be integrated into STEM curriculums at schools in the U.S.

Use of the bidding box – Alerts and Announcements

When using bidding boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time. A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made

A bridge partnership in 2020: Columbus and Gatlinburg

Single boards do not prove anything, I guess, but on this deal one could make the argument that both North and South could or should have done better – and the result certainly bears that out.



I'm going to go out on as limb and say that blame could be equally divided here after a spade lead held North to six tricks in 3NT. South should have known that even facing three hearts his hand might be worthless in notrump. He should make a Texas transfer and settle in 4Ψ . North, with his doubleton honor blocking that suit and two relatively open suits, should convert to 4Ψ . (Sure, partner could have a singleton club, but he doesn't have to – and even if he does, they may not lead the killing suit, whatever that is.)

The response to that might be: "What if partner had jack-fifth of hearts and an 8-count – now I look very silly in 4♥." Answer: With that hand, South shouldn't transfer. If you don't want to play the 5-3 fit, use Stayman and bid 3NT unless you find the 5-4 fit.

West led the ♥K and continued with a low heart, which Brogeland, playing for Rosenthal, ruffed.

The opponents' big fit in the unbid diamond suit offered some clues. Because East would have opened $1 \bullet$ if he had five of them, Brogeland concluded West must be 5–5 in the red suits. With a singleton club, West would likely shift, so Brogeland decided to play him for 1=5=5=2.

Brogeland led a diamond, won by West, who played a third heart. Declarer ruffed again and played his second diamond, which was ducked by West. When East won the •A, he didn't have a heart to lead. Nothing looked appealing, so he continued with a diamond

With the location of the red-suit honors known, Brogeland played East for the ♣Q based on the bidding. He pitched the ♣10, unblocking the suit, and ruffed in dummy, then played the ♣J, covered by the king and ace. He then overtook his ♣J with the king and ran the ♣7, which held, allowing him to remain in dummy to finesse spades a second time. Losing just two diamonds and a heart, Brogeland made 4♠ doubled.

At the other table, playing for Zimmermann, Geir Helgemo also reached 44 and was allowed to play undoubled. The play started out similarly until Helgemo played the second diamond. West won and continued hearts, forcing declarer to ruff at third time. With only one dummy entry, Helgemo was unable to take three finesses through East and went down three. Minus 150 would normally be a fine result when your teammates have a vulnerable game, but not this time.

Rosenthal picked up 12 IMPs on this board and 10 on the next to turn a tied match into a 22-IMP lead, which they roughly held for the remaining seven boards.

Appealing a ruling

Players in NABC+ events who want to appeal a director's ruling initiate the process by speaking with the director who delivered the original ruling. The table director will fill out paperwork regarding the appeal, and the appellants will explain what they believe to be wrong with the initial ruling. From there, the case may be handled by a variety of means. When the appeals reviewer receives the case, the circumstances of that particular case will determine whether the case can be resolved by the original staff (in the case of misapplication of Law or regulation, for instance), a panel of directors, or even a committee-type hearing which could include bridge experts.

Smoking Policy

Smoking is not permitted in the playing area during any bridge playing event at an NABC. This includes electronic smoking devices.



NABC Electronic Device Policy

Except by permission of the director in charge, any electronic equipment or device capable of receiving or sending an electronic signal, or capable of communicating in any way, may not be operated or functioning in any manner



in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session and must remain off at all times.

The above restrictions apply to all players, captains, coaches, kibitzers and play recorders except those persons granted permission by the ACBL, and are in force throughout any playing session or segment of play. Further restrictions and requirements apply in events involving live internet and/or vugraph coverage.

A violation of any of the above restrictions will result in an automatic penalty, pursuant to Law 91 of the Laws of Duplicate Bridge.

NABC+ events

- First offense of any kind (ringing, answering or initiating a call, texting or browsing) in a session: One full board, 12 IMPs or 20% of the maximum available VPs per match, at the respective form of scoring.
- Second offense in the same session or third offense within the event, disqualification of the pair or team from the event.

Other events

- First offense, in the same session ringing only: one-quarter board, 3 IMPs or 1 VP, at the respective form of scoring; first offense in the same session answering or initiating a call, texting or browsing: one-half board, 6 IMPs or 2 VPs, at the respective form of scoring.
- Second offense in the same session: two full boards, 20 IMPs or 50% of the maximum available VPs per match, at the respective form of scoring.
- Third offense in the event: disqualification of the pair or team from the event.

Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the

This policy applies to all events at NABCs.

Player Memos

Player Memo stations are located on the "upper" B2 Level in the Marriott next to the Fedex office and on the lower level opposite Salon 6.

Some "Recorder Reminders":

When filing a Player Memo, please include names and compass locations, and please include the name of any tournament director involved.

When an irregularity occurs, call the director. Do not make your own ruling or allow partner or opponents to do so.

Once hands are removed from the boards, all calls, questions, comments and plays will be in English. Exceptions may be made if all four players at the table agree to use some common language understood by all four players.

Entries

A valid ACBL player number is required to play in all events at the NABC.

All North American championships with no upper masterpoint limit \$30 per player per session

(For team events, this means \$120 per team per session for four-person teams, \$150 per team per session for five-person teams, and \$180 per team per session for six-person teams. Only ACBL members current on their dues and service fees are eligible to play in NABC+ events. \$1.50 per person per session benefits the International Fund.)

Other North American championships \$22 per player per session (For the team events, this means \$88 per team per session for teams of four, \$110 per team per session for teams of five, and \$132 per team per session for teams of six. Only ACBL members current on their dues and service fees are eligible to play in these events.)

Regional championships \$20 for ACBL members, \$24 for inactive members per player per session

(For multi-session team events of three sessions or more, the entry fee is \$80, \$100 or \$120 for teams of four, five or six, respectively. For team events of one or two sessions, the entry fee is \$80.)

Events with a masterpoint limit of 300 or lower \$15 for ACBL members, \$19 for inactive members per player per session

Screen fees \$10 per session per pair and \$20 per session per team is added to events when screens are in use.

Coup, coup, kachoo By Barry Rigal

On this deal from the second qualifying session of the Blue Ribbon Pairs, Ira Hessel took advantage of his good luck – a 5-1 trump break against him in a slam – to get almost all the matchpoints here. But ever the perfectionist, he wasn't happy with his line of play, and indeed he admitted he had missed the best technical play. Hessel was playing with Alex Kolesnik.

As often happens when one hand is cuebidding and one hand is using key card, the second-best contract was reached (6NT is better than 90%, and when it goes down to 5-1 diamonds, 6♦ often is down in top tricks too ... but you might recover in 6NT with clubs 3-2). No I'm not bitter.

In 6♦, Hessel's task was slightly simplified by a heart lead into the tenace. He won in hand and tested diamonds to find the bad news; he led the ◆J, ducked, then tried to cash the ♣A K. When North pitched a spade, Hessel ruffed his winner and played the ♠K, then a spade to the ace. Fortunately for him, North still had to follow, so now a club ruff and the ♥A saw winning clubs led, for the trump coup.

Slightly better, Ira thought, after three rounds of trump was to play the \triangle A and ruff a club. If all follow, then the \bigvee A, club ruff, \triangle A and winning clubs. If South pitches on the second club, as here, cross to dummy in that suit, ruff a club, cross to dummy in the other suit and run the clubs for the trump coup. (If North is 5=2=5=1 you cannot make it by normal methods – you would need to play for the trump coup before discovering the bad trump break.)


Margie Cole, playing with Alejandro Bianchedi, found the trump coup here:

The lead was a top club ruffed. Cole played the ♥A and a heart to the queen, and a club was returned and ruffed. Now Cole tried the ◆A and a diamond to the ◆10 and jack. East played the ◆K and a fourth diamond, letting Cole win and cash three spades to be in dummy for the trump coup. Nine tricks made, and a win on the board when 4♥ went two down. But it was possible to do even better on the N-S cards, as shown by John Twineham and John Hodges:

After a friendly diamond lead to the queen, king and ace, Twineham assumed that West had a singleton diamond and played the ♥A and a second heart (the fall of the ♥9 might persuade you to shift to diamonds at trick two, but West might score a goal in that instance if he had false-carded from ♥9 x). After two rounds of hearts, East could perhaps have seen the trump coup looming. When he played a club (as opposed to the ◆J and another diamond), declarer ruffed and led a diamond up himself. East won and continued diamonds, declarer won in dummy, ruffed a club, cashed his ◆7 and had reached this ending:



Twineham could cash three rounds of spades to discard his diamond winner and remain in dummy to score a trump en passant.

A bit of magic from Chennai

Indian expert Prahalad Rajkumar reported a few neat deals to the Daily Bulletin. The first one comes from the first qualifying session of the Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs. Rajkumar was playing with Richard Popper of Wilmington DE.

At unfavorable vulnerability on Board 9, Rajkumar held:

♣J8 ♥J86 ♦KJ75 ♣10642.
```

His right-hand opponent opened 4♥, LHO bid 4♠ as RKCB for hearts, opener showed two key cards and the ♥Q, and LHO bid 7♥, ending the auction. What would you lead from his hand?


Reasoning that the dummy would be very strong and that declarer might need a diamond finesse to bring home the contract, Rajkumar gambled on a low diamond lead (the 7, third-best). This turned out to be critical to the defense, as this was the full layout (rotated):

Because it's unlikely that a defender would underlead a side-suit king against a grand slam, and because the spade suit will often provide the tricks needed for the slam to succeed, declarer did not take the diamond finesse at trick one. Instead, he took the ace, drew trumps and went after spades. When the

suit proved to be 5-2, the contract could no longer be made. On any other lead, declarer has time to discover that the spades aren't 4-3 and can take the diamond finesse as a last resort.

Plus 50 was worth 93% of the matchpoints. The next deal (rotated) comes from the first qualifying session of the Mitchell Open BAM Teams:

West led the ◆K and then the ◆Q, ruffed in dummy. Declarer then played three rounds of trump ending in dummy, and Rajkumar then called for the ◆10. East covered with the jack, and declarer ducked. When East continued with a low heart (not the king), Rajkumar felt sure the suit was 5-2, so he rose with the ace.

Hoping for 5-5 diamonds, Rajkumar next played the ♣A, ♣K and another club, putting West on lead. With nothing but diamonds left, West was forced to give declarer a ruff-sluff, allowing him to park his heart loser.

Making four was good for a win on the board.
